AN ACT to amend "An act to fix the work-week for the State service and to provide for compensatory time off or compensation for overtime services," approved April 27, 1951 (P. L. 1951, c. 51).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section 1 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended to read
2 as follows:

3 1. The work-week for basic annual salary for employees in the State
4 service, insofar as practicable and except as provided in section 2 of this act,
5 shall not be more than 40 hours; and, notwithstanding any inconsistent pro-
6 visions of law, any employee in the State service who is authorized or re-
7 quired to work in any week more than the hours of work established as the
8 regular and normal work-week for that class or agency shall be eligible to
9 receive [either compensatory time off or] compensation for the hours worked
10 in excess of the established work-week for that class or agency at a rate
11 representing *1 1/2 times the individual's hourly, per diem or weekly rate cal-*
12 *culated by* a proration of the annual salary rate of the individual employee in
13 accordance with the following formula:

- 14 a. Hourly rate to be equivalent to $\frac{1}{2000}$ of the annual rate.
15 b. Per diem rate to be equivalent to $\frac{1}{250}$ of the annual rate.
16 c. Weekly rate to be equivalent to $\frac{1}{50}$ of the annual rate.

1 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1966.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

STATEMENT

This bill revises the provisions of existing law as to the manner of appointment to career legal positions in the Division of Law and establishes a nucleus of able, career attorneys on a permanent basis in the Attorney General's office. The bill implements a proposal contained in the Report of the Governor's Committee on Efficiency and Economy in State Government.

Amend page 1, section 1, line 11, delete “, per diem or weekly”.

Amend page 1, section 1, line 12, after the word “employee”, insert “.”.

Amend page 1, section 1, lines 12 through 16, delete “in accordance with the following formula:

- a. Hourly rate to be equivalent to $\frac{1}{2000}$ of the annual rate.
- b. Per diem rate to be equivalent to $\frac{1}{250}$ of the annual rate.
- c. Weekly rate to be equivalent to $\frac{1}{50}$ of the annual rate.”.

Amend page 1, section 1, line 16, after line 16, add the following new section:

“2. Section 2 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended to read as follows:

“2. The **[State Treasurer, the President of the] Civil Service Commission**, the Director of Budget and Accounting in the Department of the Treasury, the chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the General Assembly**]** shall have authority to designate the classes of positions or individual positions to which the provisions of this act shall apply and may exclude from such designations any class of positions or individual positions where the conditions of employment and the nature of the duties performed or the difficulty of maintaining adequate time controls make it impracticable to establish a specific work-week and to apply to such classes of positions or individual positions the provisions of this act; shall determine the eligibility of any employee or any class of employees
