PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1988 SESSION

**AN ACT** concerning public golf courses and supplementing P.L. 1945, c. 282 (C. 40:61-22.7 et seq.) and P.L. 1958, c. 94 (C. 40:32-7.6 et seq.).

**BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1. Any municipality, which has received federal or State funds for the acquisition or development of public golf courses and which offers reduced senior citizen rates to its residents, may allow any resident of the State 62 years of age or older to use these golf courses at the reduced rate.

2. Any county, which has received federal or State funds for the acquisition or development of public golf courses and which offers reduced senior citizen rates to its residents, may allow any resident of the State 62 years of age or older to use these golf courses at the reduced rate.

3. This act shall take effect January 1 next following enactment.

**STATEMENT**

This bill permits counties and municipalities which have received State or Federal funds for the acquisition and development of public golf courses and which offer reduced rates to their resident senior citizens to offer the same reduced rate to nonresident senior citizens who are 62 years of age or older.

ASSEMBLY SENIOR CITIZENS COMMITTEE

The Assembly Senior Citizens Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 847.

This bill permits a municipality or a county which has received federal or State funds for the acquisition or development of public golf courses and which offers reduced rates to its senior citizen residents, to offer the same reduced rate to nonresident senior citizens who are 62 years of age or older.

Currently, under section 6 of P.L.1945, c.282 (C.40:61-22.11) and section 6 of P.L.1958, c.94 (C.40:32-7.11), municipalities and counties, respectively, may establish and collect reasonable fees for admission to, and use of, local public golf courses.

The bill also provides that the provisions shall not take effect until January 1 next following enactment in order to permit those counties and municipalities which wish to offer reduced rates to nonresident senior citizens to adopt budgets which would reflect any revenue changes which may occur as a result of their decision.

The Senate County and Municipal Government Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 847.

Senate Bill No. 847 permits counties and municipalities which have received State or federal funds for the acquisition and development of public golf courses and which offer reduced rates to their resident senior citizens to offer the same reduced rate to nonresident senior citizens who are 62 years of age or older.

Currently, under section 6 of P.L. 1945, c. 282 (C. 40:61-22.11) and section 6 of P.L. 1958, c. 94 (C. 40:32-7.11), municipalities and counties, respectively, may establish and collect reasonable fees for admission to, and use of, local public golf courses. It is the Committee's understanding that reduced senior citizen rates are available for residents at a number of public golf courses. This bill would permit a municipality or county which has received federal or State funds and which provides reduced rates to resident senior citizens to provide such reduced rates to any senior citizen residing in the State who is 62 years of age or older.

The bill also provides that the provisions shall not take effect until January 1 next following enactment in order to permit those counties and municipalities which wish to offer reduced rates to nonresident senior citizens to adopt budgets which would reflect any revenue changes which may occur as a result of their decision.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1988 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
