AN ACT to amend "An act to regulate the sale of certain poultry commonly known as 'baby chicks' and providing penalties for the violation thereof," approved April fourth, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight (P. L. 1938, c. 82).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*  
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section two of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 2. Any person who desires to offer baby chicks for sale at any auction  
4 or auction sale barn or community sale, shall apply for a permit so to do to  
5 the secretary of agriculture on a form which shall be prescribed and fur-  
6 nished by him. The application shall be signed by the person who proposes  
7 to conduct such sale together with the person who owns the property in or  
8 on which such sale is to be conducted, if the person who proposes to conduct  
9 such sale does not own such property. The application shall designate the  
10 date of the proposed sale, the number and breed of the chicks which are  
11 to be offered for sale and the person by whom they were produced, and shall  
12 be accompanied by a fee in the sum of five dollars (\$5.00) for each and  
13 every day or fraction thereof during or on which it is proposed to sell such  
14 baby chicks. The [chief] director of the [bureau] Division of Animal In-  
15 dustry is hereby authorized in his discretion to grant or to deny the per-

16 mit requested in such application, and, if deemed necessary or advisable, to  
17 require the applicant to submit a certificate, in such form as the secretary of  
18 agriculture may prescribe, certifying that the baby chicks which are to be  
19 offered for sale are in a healthy condition and free from such diseases as  
20 the secretary of agriculture may designate.

1       2. This act shall take effect immediately.

- A 73 Thomas Jan. 30—Requires a bank or savings bank applying for a charter, to set forth in its certificate of incorporation that the entire capital stock has been subscribed; that each subscriber has undertaken in writing to pay in cash his share of the capital stock, surplus and reserve fund and—in savings banks—his share of capital deposits; provides method of amending a certificate of incorporation prior to payment of capital.
