AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act concerning free public libraries," approved April fourteenth, one thousand nine hundred and five.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section four of the act of which this act is amendatory, be and the same  
2 is hereby amended so that it shall read as follows:

3 4. It shall be lawful to raise by taxation annually for the support and use  
4 of said library, in addition to the sum required to be raised by section three, a sum  
5 not exceeding **[one-sixth]** two-thirds of a mill on every dollar of assessable prop-  
6 erty in such municipality; and the sums assessed and collected by virtue of this  
7 act shall be used for no other purpose than for the use of a free public library.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately

STATEMENT.

The purpose of this act is to permit a municipality to take care of library maintenance, where in the discretion of the governing body, such additional maintenance is justifiable.
