AN ACT to amend "An act creating the New Jersey Racing Commission and defining its powers and duties; providing for the granting of permits and licenses for the operation of race meetings whereat the running, steeplechase racing or harness racing of horses only may be conducted; providing for the licensing of concessionaires and operators and their employees; regulating the system of pari-mutuel betting and fixing the license fees, taxes and revenues imposed hereunder and fixing penalties for violations of the provisions of this act," approved March eighteenth, one thousand nine hundred and forty (P. L. 1940, c. 17), as said Title was amended by chapter one hundred thirty-seven of the laws of one thousand nine hundred and forty-one.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New*
2 *Jersey:*

1 1. Section four of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 4. The commissioners shall receive no salaries but **[they]** shall **[each]**
4 be allowed reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their official
5 duties in an amount not exceeding **[five hundred dollars (\$500.00)]** thirty-
6 five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) per annum in the case of the chairman, and
7 one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per annum in the case of each of the other
8 commissioners. The commission may employ a secretary, an attorney who is

9 a counsellor-at-law, a chief inspector and such other assistant secretaries,
10 attorneys and inspectors, clerks, stenographers, and other employees as may
11 be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act, all of whom shall have
12 been actual residents of the State of New Jersey for at least five years and
13 shall serve during the pleasure of the commission and receive such compen-
13 sation and perform such duties as the commission may determine; *provided,*
14 *however,* that no person shall be employed by the commission or hold any
15 office or position under the commission who holds any official relation to
16 any association or corporation engaged in or conducting horse racing or
17 who holds stock or bonds therein, or who has any pecuniary interest therein.
18 The provisions of Title 11, Revised Statutes, and acts amendatory thereof
19 and supplemental thereto, shall be construed to extend to all of the offices,
20 positions and employments mentioned in this section with the exception of
21 the following: Commissioners, secretary, assistant secretaries, chief inspec-
22 tor, assistant inspectors, attorneys, assistant attorneys and all special and
23 part-time employees.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
