STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: DECEMBER 18, 1989

The Senate Revenue, Finance and Appropriations Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 5094, with committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 5094, as amended, increases the maximum annual salaries of heads of the principal executive agencies, including the Commissioners of the Board of Public Utilities, from \$95,000 to \$115,000, beginning January 1, 1991. The present salaries were authorized in 1986.

This bill, as amended, is identical to Senate Bill No. 3985, as amended.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The Committee amendments remove the condition that this bill does not take effect until enactment of three other bills, Assembly Bills Nos. 5093, 5095 and 5096.

FISCAL IMPACT

This bill contains no appropriation. The bill increases the annual salary of a head of an agency by \$20,000. The salaries of 22 officials will be affected, so the annual cost of the increase will be \$440,000. Since the bill takes effect halfway through FY 1991, the increased cost will be \$220,000 for that year. The full annual cost will first be incurred in FY 1992.
