AN ACT ¹[to provide for the regulation and certificationof] concerning¹ contact lens dispensers ${}^{2}[1and fitters^{1}]^{2}$ and supplementing P.L.1952, c.336 (C.52:17B-41.1 et seq.).

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

7 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Contact Lens Dispenser ²[¹and Fitters¹]² Act." 8

2. As used in this act:

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²["Board" means the State Board of Examiners of 10 a. Ophthalmic Dispensers and Ophthalmic Technicians. 11

b.]² ¹"Practice of contact lens dispensing" means the sale or 12 delivery of contact lenses to the patient based upon the 13 prescription of powers for vision and specifications for contact 14 lenses for the patient as provided by a licensed physician or 15 optometrist ²[, or, in the case of fitting specifications, by a 16 contact lens fitter $]^2$. The practice includes, but is not limited 17 to, the analysis and interpretation of prescriptions and 18 specifications for contact lenses; the preparation of orders and 19 20 the grinding for fabrication of contact lenses; the instruction of 21 the patient as to the proper insertion, removal, care and the use 22 of the contact lenses; and the duplication, reproduction and 23 replacement of previously prepared contact lenses.

²[c.¹ "Practice of contact lens ¹[dispensing] fitting¹" means 24 the design, measurement, verification 1[,] or fitting 1[or 25 delivery]¹ of contact lenses to the patient based upon the 26 27 prescription of powers for vision of the patient and approval for 28 contact lenses as provided in the prescription of a licensed 29 optometrist or physician. The practice includes, but is not 30 limited to, ¹[the analysis and interpretation of prescriptions and 31 specifications for contact lenses;] those practices set forth in 32 subsection b. of this section, as well as¹ the taking of 33 measurements to determine the size, shape and specifications for 34 contact lenses; ¹[the preparation of orders and the grinding for 35 fabricating of contact lenses;]¹ the verification of the quality and 36 fit of contact lenses; ¹[the adjustment of contact lenses to the 37 patient's eyes; the instruction of the patient as to the proper 38 insertion, removal, care and the use of the contact lenses;]¹ and

the ¹[adjustment,]¹ reevaluation ¹[,] <u>and</u>¹ repair ¹[, duplication, reproduction and replacement]¹ of previously prepared contact lenses. The practice shall not include the examination of the eye for the purpose of ascertaining any departure from normal vision.

5 $1[c.] \underline{d.}^{1}] \underline{b.}^{2}$ "Prescription" means written instructions or 6 orders from a licensed physician or optometrist stating the 7 powers of vision of a person.

8 ¹[d.] ²[<u>e.</u>¹] <u>c.</u>² "Duplication" means the replacement or 9 reproduction of contact lenses based upon a prescription or 10 specifications of record.

²[¹[e.] <u>f.</u>¹ "Contact lens ¹[dispenser] <u>fitter</u>¹" means a person
 certified to practice contact lens ¹[dispensing] <u>fitting</u>¹ pursuant
 to the provisions of this act.]²

¹3. Any ophthalmic dispenser licensed in New Jersey may
 engage in the practice of contact lens dispensing.¹

16 ²[¹[3.] 4.¹ There is created in the Division of Consumer 17 Affairs of the Department of Law and Public Safety, within the 18 State Board of Examiners of Ophthalmic Dispensers and Ophthalmic Technicians, a Contact Lens ¹[Dispensers] Fitters¹ 19 Advisory Committee which shall ascertain the facts concerning 20 the $1[dispensing,]^1$ fitting 1[, and sale $]^1$ of contact lenses for the 21 purpose of advising the board about the need for, and desirability 22 of, rules and regulations to promote the health, safety, and 23 24 welfare of the public and to effectuate the purposes of this act.

The advisory committee shall consist of three members 25 26 appointed by the board with the approval of the Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs. One member of the advisory 27 committee shall be a physician licensed to practice in the State 28 of New Jersey who is a diplomate of the American Board of 29 Ophthalmology with a minimum of five years of current 30 experience in the ¹[dispensing] fitting¹ of contact lenses; one 31 member shall be an optometrist licensed to practice in the State 32 of New Jersey with a minimum of five years of current 33 experience in the ¹[dispensing] <u>fitting¹</u> of contact lenses; and one 34 member shall be experienced in the practice of contact lens 35 ¹[dispensing] fitting¹ and a faculty member or instructor in a 36 37 board-approved ophthalmic science program. After the board has certified one or more contact lens ¹[dispenser] fitters¹ in 38 accordance with the provisions of this act, whom the board judges 39 to be qualified to serve on the advisory committee, a fourth 40 member who is a contact lens ¹[dispenser] <u>fitter</u>¹ shall be 41 appointed by the board with the approval of the Director of the 42 43 Division of Consumer Affairs; and thereafter the advisory 44 committee shall consist of four members. Members of the 45 advisory committee shall be appointed for a term of three years and shall serve thereafter until reappointed or until a successor is 46 named.] 2 47

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lens ¹[dispenser] <u>fitter</u>¹ or shall engage in the practice of contact lens ¹[dispensing] <u>fitting</u>¹ unless he is certified in accordance with the provisions of this act; except that nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit any person licensed to practice in this State under any other law from engaging in the practice for which he is licensed ¹[; and, provided that any ophthalmic dispenser licensed in New Jersey may engage in the sale of contact lenses directly to the consumer upon a written spectacle prescription with contact lens specifications]¹.]²

(1) Is an ophthalmic dispenser licensed to practice in this State;

7 The apprenticeship training shall be under the supervision of a 8 licensed physician, optometrist or ophthalmic dispenser who is contact lens ¹[dispenser] 9 certified as a fitter¹. The 10 apprenticeship training shall consist of experience in the fitting and adapting of contact lenses, ¹[the verification and 11 interpretation of specifications for contact lenses] those 12 practices as set forth in the definition of the practice of contact 13 lens fitting in subsection c. of section 2 of this act^1 , and other 14 aspects of the practice and theory of contact lens ¹[dispensing] 15 fitting¹ as reasonably required by the board. The candidate's 16 preceptor shall certify to the board that the candidate has 17 successfully completed the training before the candidate may 18 qualify to take the written examination administered by the 19 board for certification. 20

A contact lens apprentice shall apply for and pass one of the 21 first three written examinations for certification administered by 22 immediately following completion 23 the board of the apprenticeship, but the board may grant an extension of 24 application to the next succeeding examination for good cause. If 25 a candidate is unsuccessful in passing one of these three written 26 examinations he shall return his permit and cease working as a 27 contact lens ¹[dispenser] fitter¹ apprentice.]² 28

 2 [1[9.] <u>10.</u>¹ The board shall levy fees for applications, 29 examinations, apprentice permits, certifications, certificate 30 renewals and other services it performs as may be required to 31 cover the costs associated with the administration of this act.]² 32

 2 [1[10.] 11.¹ Certification shall be issued for a period of two 33 years and shall be renewed by the board upon payment of the 34 35 required fee and proof of having completed the required number of continuing education credits unless revoked or suspended by 36 the board pursuant to the provisions of P.L.1978, c.73 (C.45:1-14 37 et seq.). The board shall automatically revoke or suspend the 38 certificate of any certified contact lens ¹[dispenser] <u>fitter</u>¹ 39 whose ophthalmic dispenser's license has been revoked or 40 suspended.]² 41

42 2 [1[11.] 12.¹ The board shall require that holders of contact lens certificates from time to time provide satisfactory evidence 43 44 of the completion of courses in continuing education in the practice of contact lens 1[dispensing] <u>fitting</u>1.]² 45

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a notation by the prescribing physician or optometrist that the 1 patient is a suitable candidate on whom to initiate the contact 2 lens ¹[dispensing] <u>fitting</u>¹ process. A prescription containing a 3 spectacle lens specification and a notation of "for contact 4 lenses" or similar words shall be deemed adequate for the 5 ¹[dispensing] <u>fitting</u>¹ of contact lenses by a contact lens 6 ¹[dispenser] fitter¹] written prescription provided by a licensed 7 physician or optometrist containing the powers of vision and 8 specifications for contact lenses for the patient². 9

10 $2[1[13.] \underline{14.}^{1}$ Upon completion of the contact lens 1[dispensing]11 $\underline{fitting}^{1}$ procedure $1 \underline{or}$ the dispensing of contact lenses 1, a 12 contact lens $1[dispenser] \underline{fitter}$ or ophthalmic dispenser, as the 13 $\underline{case may be}, 1$ shall refer the patient back to the prescribing 14 physician or optometrist.]²

¹⁵ ¹[14.] ²[<u>15.</u>¹] <u>5.</u>² Previously dispensed contact lenses shall only be replaced, reproduced, or duplicated ¹[by a contact lens dispenser]¹ upon the prescription or specifications of record, a copy of which shall be provided by the original contact lens ¹[dispenser] ²[<u>fitter</u>¹] <u>prescriber or dispenser</u>² upon the patient's request; provided that the prescription or specifications of record are not more than two years old.

²[1[15.] <u>16.</u>¹ The board shall adopt rules and regulations 22 establishing examination content and procedures, qualifications 23 for contact lens ¹[dispensers] <u>fitters</u>¹, including educational 24 qualifications, qualifications of preceptors, the quality of training 25 and supervision by preceptors, criteria for the professional 26 practice of contact lens ¹[dispensing] <u>fitting¹</u> by a certified 27 contact lens ¹[dispenser] fitter¹, and, pursuant to P.L.1978, c.73 28 (C.45:1-14 et seq.), penalties for the violation of any of the 29 provisions of this $act.]^2$ 30

Notwithstanding any rule or regulation to the contrary, the 13 14 complete record of contact lens specifications shall be released by an optometrist or ophthalmologist to the patient or to another 15 ophthalmologist, optometrist or ophthalmic dispenser licensed in 16 the State of New Jersey upon either the oral or written request 17 of the patient or professional acting on the patient's behalf.² 18

STATEMENT

This bill provides for the regulation and certification of contact lens dispensers by the State Board of Examiners of Ophthalmic Dispensers and Ophthalmic Technicians. The bill also permits licensed ophthalmic dispensers to sell contact lens directly to the consumer upon a written spectacle prescription with contact lens specifications.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: FEBRUARY 25, 1991

The Senate Labor, Industry and Professions Committee reports without recommendation and with committee amendments Senate, No. 2546.

This bill, as amended by the committee, provides for the regulation and certification of contact lens fitters by the State Board of Examiners of Ophthalmic Dispensers and Ophthalmic Technicians. The practice of contact lens fitting means the design, measurement, verification or fitting of contact lenses to the patient based upon the prescription powers for vision of the patient and approval for contact lenses as provided in the prescription of an optometrist or physician.

A Contact Lens Fitters Advisory Committee is created within the board to ascertain the facts concerning the fitting of contact lenses for the purpose of advising the board about the need for rules and regulations to effectuate the purposes of this act. The advisory committee will at first consist of a physician who is a diplomate of the American Board of Ophthalmology with at least five years of current experience in the fitting of contact lenses, an optometrist with at least five years of current experience in the fitting of contact lenses, and a faculty member or instructor in a board-approved ophthalmic science program with experience in the practice of contact lens fitting. Later, a contact lens fitter certified by the board will be appointed as the fourth member of the advisory committee.

To be eligible for certification as a contact lens fitter, an applicant must be an ophthalmic dispenser licensed in this State and have either:

a. Completed an educational program approved by the board, successfully completed a clinical program in contact lens fitting of at least 300 hours or successfully completed at least one year of apprenticeship in fitting contact lenses, and passed a written examination; or

b. Passed the current board-approved examination for contact lens fitters within two years prior to the date of application for certification, successfully completed a board-approved educational program or another substantially similar course of study, and passed a board-approved practical examination.

The bill requires the board to use as its written examination the National Contact Lens Examiners examination or any other substantially equivalent independently prepared and administered examination. Board-approved apprenticeship programs are provided for in the bill and the apprenticeship training for contact lens fitting would be under the supervision of a licensed physician, optometrist or ophthalmic dispenser who is certified as a contact lens fitter.

A certified contact lens fitter would be required to complete courses of continuing education in contact lens fitting to renew the certification.

The bill provides that a contact lens fitter must only fit contact lenses upon a written spectacle lens prescription with a notation by the prescribing physician or optometrist that the patient is a suitable candidate for fitting contact lenses. Upon completion of the contact lens fitting procedure, a contact lens fitter must refer the patient back to the prescribing physician or optometrist.

The bill also permits licensed ophthalmic dispensers to dispense contact lenses directly to the consumer upon a written spectacle lens prescription with contact lens specifications. This dispensing includes the analysis and interpretation of prescriptions and specifications for contact lenses; the grinding for fabrication of contact lenses; instruction as to proper insertion, removal, care and use of contact lenses, and the sale of contact lenses. Upon dispensing contact lenses, an ophthalmic dispenser must refer the patient back to the prescribing physician or optometrist.

The bill also requires that a prescribing optometrist or physician must release a prescription containing a spectacle lens specification with contact lens specifications to any person qualified to dispense contact lenses (a physician, optometrist, ophthalmic dispenser or contact lens fitter) or a prescription containing spectacle lens specifications and a notation for contact lenses to any certified contact lens fitter upon the patient's request. However, the bill does not require a physician or optometrist to release a prescription authorizing the initiation of the contact lens fitting process when initiation of the process is contraindicated. Nor does it require a person permitted to treat ocular pathology to release a prescription for contact lenses for therapeutic purposes in treating an ocular pathology, but contact lens fitters may fit these therapeutic lenses on direct referral from a person qualified to treat disease.
