#### INTRODUCED MAY 20, 1991

#### By Senator CODEY

1 AN ACT concerning the licensing of blood banks and amending 2 P.L.1963, c.33. 3 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the 4 5 State of New Jersey: 1. Section 3 of P.L.1963, c.33 (C.26:2A-4) is amended to read 6 7 as follows: 3. a. No person shall hereafter operate or conduct a blood 8 bank in this State unless duly licensed by the commissioner under 9 the provisions of this act. The licenses required by this act shall 10 be in addition to any other license or permit required by any local 11 board of health or other body exercising the powers of such a 12 board in any municipality in this State. 13 14 All such licenses shall expire on December 31 in each calendar year and application for renewal therefor shall be made on or 15before November 10 on forms provided by the department. The original or a certified copy of the license shall be 21 conspicuously displayed by the licensee at the premises occupied 22 23 as a blood bank. b. <sup>1</sup>(1) The fee for transfusion services shall be based on the 24 number of transfusions performed at a facility and shall range 25from a minimum fee of \$200 for a facility which performs up to 261,000 transfusions to a maximum fee of \$700 for a facility which 27 performs more than 5,000 transfusions a year; 28 29 (2) The fee for collection centers shall be based on the number of collections made by a facility and shall range from a minimum 30 fee of \$250 for a facility which makes up to 200 collections to a 31 32 maximum fee of \$1,900 for a facility which makes more than 50,000 collections a year; 33 (3) The fee for other blood bank services shall be as follows: 34 Collection Site – \$100 35 36 Broker – \$200 37 Industrial Blood Bank - \$200 Home Transfusion Service – \$200 38 39 The commissioner may, pursuant to the "Administrative

The Senate Institutions, Health and Welfare Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 3497.

This bill provides that the Commissioner of Health may establish fees for the licensure of blood banks in such amounts as he determines to be necessary to conduct blood bank licensure operations. Currently, licensing fees are set at \$25.00 for an initial license and \$10.00 for each renewal. The bill also provides that income received from licensure and renewal fees shall be appropriated to the Department of Health to effectuate the purposes of the blood bank licensing statute, P.L.1963, c.33 (C.26:2A-2 et seq.).

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### DATED: DECEMBER 9, 1991

The Senate Institutions, Health and Welfare Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 3497 with committee amendments.

As amended by committee, this bill increases the fees for licensure and renewal of licenses for blood banks. The fees are increased to ensure that the amounts collected by the Department of Health are sufficient for the department to conduct its blood bank licensure operation. The new fee schedule will be based on the number and type of service (i.e., transfusions, collections, etc.) that the facility provides. For example, a facility which performs up to 1,000 transfusions a year will pay an annual fee of \$200, whereas a facility which performs over 5,000 transfusions a year will pay an annual fee of \$700. The bill also authorizes the Commissioner of Health to periodically increase the fees, by regulation, to reflect increased State costs in blood bank licensure operations.

The bill also provides that income received from licensure and renewal fees shall be appropriated to the Department of Health to effectuate the purposes of the blood bank licensing statute.

Currently, licensing fees are set at \$25.00 for an initial license and \$10.00 for each renewal. These fees were established in 1963 and have not been changed since then.

The committee amended the bill to specify the amounts of the increases in the fees rather than provide the Commissioner of Health with broad authority to set the fees.

The committee considered and favorably reported this bill on June 17, 1991. The bill was recommitted to committee on July 15, 1991 for further consideration.
