4 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
5 State of New Jersey:

6 1. Section 4 of P.L.1981, c.496 (C.40:44-12) is amended to
7 read as follows:

8 4. Each ward commissioner shall be entitled to be reimbursed
9 for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his duties
10 and to such compensation as the governing body may provide by
11 ordinance or resolution.

12 The ward commissioners shall be entitled in the performance of
13 their duties to the assistance of a surveyor or engineer, and, when
14 they deem necessary, may employ a surveyor or engineer and
15 such other assistants as shall be necessary to aid them in the
16 discharge of their duties.

17 The governing body of the municipality shall provide, upon
18 certification of the ward commissioners, for payment of the
19 expenses of the ward commissioners, their compensation as
20 determined by ordinance or resolution, and the expenses for the
21 services of the surveyor, engineer or other assistants as the ward
22 commissioners shall have incurred. No person employed under
23 this section shall be compensated by receiving a percentage of
24 the contract under which he renders services.
