[FIRST REPRINT] SENATE, No. 1271

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: SEPTEMBER 17, 1990

The Assembly Commerce and Regulated Professions Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1271 (1R).

This bill provides for the issuance or renewal of electrical contractor licenses and business permits for a period of three years instead of the current two years.

The Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors in its continuing education regulation requires that each licensee attend, at the time of publication of each new edition of the National Electrical Code, a course of study approved by the board relating to the new Code. Proof of completion of the Code course (consisting of nine hours of Code update and one hour on rules and regulations) is a prerequisite to renewal of a license. The National Electrical Code is revised every three years. Inasmuch as the continuing education requirement for continued licensure is compatible with a three-year period of license renewal rather than a two-year period, the bill changes this period to three years.

DATED: MARCH 5, 1990

The Senate Labor, Industry and Professions Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate, No. 1271.

This bill, as amended, provides for the issuance or renewal of electrical contractor licenses and business permits for a period of three years instead of the current two years.

The Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors in its continuing education regulation requires that each licensee attend, at the time of publication of each new edition of the National Electrical Code, a course of study approved by the board relating to the new Code. Proof of completion of the Code course (consisting of nine hours of Code update and one hour on rules and regulations) is a prerequisite to renewal of a license. However, the National Electrical Code is revised every three years and therefore the continuing education requirement for continued licensure is not compatible with a two-year period of license renewal. The bill, therefore, changes the period to three years.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
