BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1983, c.372 (C.40A:10-36) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. <sup>1</sup>a. <sup>1</sup> The governing body of any local unit <sup>1</sup>, including any contracting unit as defined in section 2 of P.L.1971, c.198 (C.40A:11-2), may by resolution or ordinance, as appropriate, agree to join together with any other local unit or units to establish a joint insurance fund for the purpose of insuring against liability, property damage, and workers' compensation as provided in Articles 3 and 4 of chapter 10 of Title 40A of the Statutes, and providing contributory or Jersey non-contributory group health insurance <sup>1</sup>or group term life insurance, or both, 1 to employees 1 and group health insurance to] or their dependents or both, and may appropriate such moneys as are required therefor. ## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: SEPTEMBER 10, 1990

The Assembly Insurance Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 297 with committee amendments.

As amended, the bill permits local units to obtain group health or life insurance for employees and their dependents through joint insurance funds.

The creation of a joint insurance fund permits two or more local units to combine for the purpose of securing insurance coverage and allowing local units to achieve insurance cost savings made possible through risk-pooling. Currently, the law permits local units to establish joint insurance funds for the purpose of insuring against liability, property damage, and workers' compensation, as provided in Articles 3 and 4 of chapter 10 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes.

The committee amended the bill to permit local units to obtain group life insurance, as well as health insurance, through joint insurance funds and to provide definitions for the terms "health insurance," "life insurance," and "dependent." The amendments also include technical changes to reflect the most recent version of the law.

Currently, the law permits local units to establish joint insurance funds for the purpose of insuring against liability, property damage, and workers' compensation, as provided in Articles 3 and 4 of chapter 10 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
