1 AN ACT adding the Commissioner of Education to the
2 membership of the Public Employees' Occupational Safety and
3 Health Advisory Board and amending P.L.1983, c.516.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the
6 State of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 4 of P.L.1983, c.516 (C.34:6A-28) is amended to
8 read as follows:

9 4. There is ~~created a Public Employees' Occupational Safety~~
10 and Health Advisory Board to assist the commissioner in
11 establishing standards for the occupational safety and health of
12 public employees. The board shall make itself available to
13 receive information regarding matters of concern to public
14 employees in the areas of occupational safety and health. The
15 advisory board, under the chairmanship of the commissioner, shall
16 consist of the Commissioner of Education, the State
17 Commissioner of [the Department of] Health, the Commissioner
18 of [the Department of] Environmental Protection, the
19 Commissioner of [the Department of] Community Affairs, [and]
20 the State Treasurer, or their designees, and 18 members to be
21 appointed by the Governor, as follows: one member representing
22 the fire service, one member representing municipalities, one
23 member representing municipal employees, one member
24 representing county government, one member representing
25 employees of county government, one member representing State
26 employees, one member representing public health care facilities,
27 one member representing employees of public health care
28 facilities, one member representing correctional institutions, one
29 member representing employees of correctional institutions, one
30 member representing law enforcement employees, one member
31 representing local school boards, one member representing local
32 school board employees, one member representing Rutgers, The
33 State University, one member representing employees in
34 institutions of higher education, and three members representing
35 the public. The members selected by the Governor shall be
36 selected on the basis of their experience and competence in the
37 field of occupational safety and health. No more than nine
38 members appointed by the Governor shall be from the same
39 political party. Each member shall serve for a term of three
40 years and until his successor is appointed and qualified. A

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STATEMENT

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14 This bill adds the Commissioner of Education to the Public
15 Employees' Occupational Safety and Health Advisory Board.
16 This 22-member board assists the Commissioner of Labor in
17 establishing standards for the occupational safety and health of
18 public employees under the "New Jersey Public Employees'
19 Occupational Safety and Health Act," P.L.1983, c.516
20 (C.34:6A-25 et seq.). Currently, the board includes: the
21 Commissioners of Labor, Health, Environmental Protection, and
22 Community Affairs and 18 public members appointed by the
23 Governor.

24 The bill also allows designees of the commissioners on the
25 board to serve in lieu of the commissioners.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
