STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: JANUARY 25, 1990

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill without committee amendments.

Under this bill the membership of the Joint Committee on the Public Schools would increase from 12 to 14, with seven members appointed from each House. In each case, at least two of the seven members would be members of the respective House's education committee. No more than four members appointed from each House could be of the same political party.

This bill would reestablish the original number of members of the Joint Committee on the Public Schools provided by the 1975 law (P.L. 1975, c. 16) under which the committee was established. P.L. 1987, c. 400 amended that law and altered the committee's composition.

ADVISORY

Governor Jim Florio today signed the following bills:

S-2254/A2879, sponsored by Senator Matthew Feldman/ Assemblymen Joseph and Wayne Bryant.

This bill changes the number of members of the Joint Committee on the Public Schools by reestablishing the original number of members at 14 as provided by the 1975 law under which the Committee was established.

S-2304 Sca/A-1391, sponsored by Senator Walter Rand and Assemblymen Wayne Bryant and Joseph J. Roberts, Jr.

This bill allows local school districts to sell school property to a private nonprofit school for the handicapped without complying with the competitive bidding process.
