AN ACT concerning medical education and amending P.L.1977, c.390.

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37 38 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 4 of P.L.1977, c.390 (C.18A:64H-4) is amended to read as follows:
- 4. The council shall consist of [14] 15 members, [10] 11 voting members and four nonvoting members; four members of the council shall be appointed by the Governor and [10] 11 shall be lex-officiol ex officio members. The appointments shall consist of three representatives of the public and one student currently enrolled in a graduate medical training program; the appointed members shall be voting members of the council. The president of the [College] University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey, who shall serve as [chair-person] chairperson; a dean from one of the medical schools of the [College] University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey, to be selected by the president of the [College] University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey; the dean of the School of Graduate Medical Education of Seton Hall University; the president of the New Jersey Hospital Association; the president of the Association of Hospital Directors of Medical Education of New Jersey; the president of the New Jersey Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons; the president of [New Jersey] the Medical Society of New Jersey or their designated representatives shall be ex officio, voting members of the council. The Chancellor of Higher Education; Commissioner of Health; the president of the State Board of Medical Examiners and the Commissioner of the Department of [Institutions and Agencies] Human Services or their designated representatives shall be ex officio, nonvoting members. The appointed members shall serve for a [3-year] three-year term or until a successor is appointed. For those first appointed, twoshall be appointed for a [1-year] one-year term; one shall be appointed for a [2-year] two-year term; and one shall be appointed for a [3-year] three-year term. Any vacancies in the voting membership other than by expiration of term shall be

filled in the same manner as the original appointment but for the unexpired term only. To assist the council in carrying out the intent of this act:

- a. The council may appoint advisory committees representative of the medical and health care professions, educators, and students, representatives of medical and health care facilities and consumers. The advisory committees shall provide advice and assistance to the council for the council's performance of its designated functions.
- b. The council may employ an executive director and additional staff to provide expertise in the gathering and analysis of data and administration. The executive director shall have the right to speak on all matters at meetings of the council but shall have no vote. The council and the advisory committees shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

STATEMENT

This bill expands the Advisory Graduate Medical Education Council of New Jersey, established pursuant to P.L.1977, c.390 (C.18A:64H-1 et seq.), to include the dean of the School of Graduate Medical Education of Seton Hall University as a voting, ex officio member.

This advisory council is directed to make recommendations to the State Board of Higher Education for the support, through federal, State and private funds, of graduate medical education programs in private nonprofit and public hospitals in the State and to make recommendations for the development and implementation of new graduate medical education programs which meet the needs of the citizens of the State. With this mandate, the advisory council plays a major role in establishing graduate medical educational policy in this State.

The School of Graduate Medical Education of Seton Hall University was authorized by the State Board of Medical Examiners, effective May 19, 1988, to conduct a school of graduate medical education in the State. It is, therefore, appropriate that a representative of this school be included on the advisory council in order to ensure that the school has a voice in establishment of medical educational policy in the State.

The Assembly Higher Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 1812.

This bill expands the Advisory Graduate Medical Education Council of New Jersey, established pursuant to P.L.1977, c.390 (C.18A:64H-1 et seq.), to include the dean of the School of Graduate Medical Education of Seton Hall University as a voting, ex officio member.

The council makes recommendations to the State Board of Higher Education for the support, through federal, State and private funds, of graduate medical education programs in private nonprofit and public hospitals in the State and also makes recommendations for the development and implementation of new graduate medical education programs. The advisory council, therefore, plays a major role in establishing graduate medical educational policy in this State.

The School of Graduate Medical Education of Seton Hall University was authorized by the State Board of Medical Examiners in May 1988 to conduct a school of graduate medical education in the State. This bill places a representative of this school on the advisory council in order to ensure that the school has a voice in establishment of medical educational policy in the State. The bill also makes several technical corrections in the law.

Representatives from UMDNJ and the Department of Higher Education spoke in opposition to the bill. A representative from Seton Hall University spoke in favor of the bill.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
