BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 1 of P.L. 1985, c. 414 (C. 43:15A-47.2) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of the act to which this act is a supplement, and except as may be otherwise provided in P.L. 1972, c. 167 (C. 43:15A-135 et seq.) [and P.L. 1983, c. 316 (C. 43:15A-47.1)], a member of the retirement system shall be eligible to retire while holding public office to which he was elected if his retirement allowance is not based solely on his service in the public office to which he was elected, and no contributions shall be required of the member covering that service, provided the member [serves only for the term for which he was elected and] receives not more than 60% of the salary to which he is entitled.

- 2. P.L. 1983, c. 316 (C. 43:15A-47.1) is repealed.
- 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

 This bill concerns the retirement of certain elected public officials who are members of the Public Employees' Retirement System. It removes the requirement that in order to retire while holding public office to which he was elected, the member serve only for the term for which he was elected. It retains the provision, however, that the member may receive no more than 60% of the salary of the public office after retirement. The bill repeals P.L. 1983, c. 316 which provides that the member may receive no salary while holding the public office to which he was elected.

The Senate Revenue, Finance and Appropriations Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 1053, with committee amendments.

Senate Bill No. 1053, as amended, permits a member of the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS) to retire while continuing to hold a public office to which the member was elected and while receiving the full salary for that office if the member's retirement allowance is not based solely on the member's service in that public office. Contributions covering the service will not be required of the member.

The bill also repeals section 1 of P.L.1983, c.316 (C.43:15A-47.1). That section provided that a member may retire while holding elected public office and may continue to hold that office without any limit or duration if the member receives no salary for this office.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amendments remove the limitation on the salary the member may receive as an elected official upon retirement. Currently, the retired PERS member may hold office if he receives not more than 60% of the salary for the elected position and serves only for the term to which elected. As received by the committee, the bill eliminated the limitation of serving for the elected term only. The committee amendments remove the salary limitation.

FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact of this bill is unknown. It is not possible to determine how many local or State elected officials there are who would choose to retire from a job with a PERS pension and also remain in elected office.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1053 [1R].

Contributions covering the service will not be required of the member.

The bill also repeals section 1 of P.L.1983, c.316 (C.43:15A-47.1). That section provided that a member may retire while holding elected public office and may continue to hold that office without any limit or duration if the member receives no salary for this office.
