BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. ¹[The provisions of any other law, or rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto to the contrary notwithstanding, no owner or operator of a major facility may transfer petroleum through pipelines that traverse the waters of the State from dusk to dawn] An owner or operator of a refinery, storage, transfer terminal, or pipeline facility, or a vessel that transports a hazardous substance, shall provide during non-daylight hours illumination for any transfer of the hazardous substance between the facility and such vessel, or among two or more vessels. Illumination shall be provided at each transfer connection point in use, and for adjacent facility or vessel areas, and surrounding waters. The intensity and area of illumination shall be sufficient in the estimation of the department, to permit the visual detection of a discharge of a hazardous substance into the land or waters of the State. To the extent practicable and necessary to effectuate the purposes of this section, the department may require illumination of locations at which underwater transmission pipelines ³[come] emerge³ onto the lands of the

The department shall, within one year of the effective date of act, adopt guidelines for the implementation of its provisions. The guidelines shall, to the maximum extent practicable, be consistent with applicable United States Coast Guard standards or requirements adopted for hazardous substance transfers from vessels during non-daylight hours.

The department may use monies from ²[fees established pursuant to section 15 of P.L. , c. (C. <u>) (pending in the</u> Legislature as Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 3262 (1990))] the New Jersey Spill Compensation Fund, as

 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. The provisions of any other law, or rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto to the contrary notwithstanding, no owner or operator of a major facility may transfer petroleum through pipelines that traverse the waters of the State from dusk to dawn.
 - 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill would prohibit the transfer of oil and other petroleum products through underwater pipelines during periods of darkness. Since these products cannot be seen on the surface of the water at night, spills may remain undetected. This measure is designed to avoid any repetition of the recent Exxon oil pipeline incident in which a discharge of 567,000 gallons of fuel oil that occurred at night was not confirmed until the following morning. Prohibiting these transfers will eliminate the potential for serious environmental damage.

ENVIRONMENT

Prohibits nighttime transfers of oil through pipelines.

Assembly Bill No. 3268, with committee amendments, is reported favorably by the Assembly Energy and Environment Committee.

This bill, as amended, requires an owner or operator of a refinery, storage, transfer terminal, or pipeline facility, or a vessel that transports a hazardous substance to illuminate, during non-daylight hours, any transfer of the hazardous substance between a facility to such vessel, or among two or more vessels. Illumination is required to be provided at each transfer connection point in use, and for adjacent facility or vessel areas, and surrounding waters. The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) may also require lighting of areas where underwater pipelines enter the lands of the State. DEP shall adopt appropriate illumination guidelines as to intensity of lighting and areas of illumination, which guidelines shall be, to the maximum extent practicable, consistent with United States Coast Guard requirements.

The committee amendments delete the prohibition on nighttime transfers; expand the bill to cover all hazardous substances, in addition to petroleum products; establish illumination requirements for on- and off-loading of hazardous substances; require DEP to adopt guidelines for illumination; delay implementation of the bill in order to allow the department time to adopt the guidelines; and authorize the use of discharge and response plan fee monies for carrying out the provisions of the bill; and allow use of New Jersey Spill Fund monies pending collection of fees.
