P.L.1990, CHAPTER 106, approved November 16, 1990 1990 Senate No. 1552

AN ACT concerning the New Jersey Historical Commission and amending N. J.S. 18A:73-22.

 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. N.J.S.18A:73-22 is amended to read as follows:
- 18A:73-22. There is hereby established in the [Division of the State Library, Archives and History of the State] Department of [Education] State, a division called the New Jersey Historical Commission to be composed of [12] 17 members as follows:
- (a) The <u>Secretary of State</u>, the State Librarian and the [supervisor of the historic sites section of the Department of Conservation and Economic Development] <u>Chief of the Office of New Jersey Heritage in the Department of Environmental Protection</u>, or their designees, who shall serve ex officio; and
- (b) [Six] Ten citizens of the State to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate, all of whom shall be chosen by reason of their expertise in New Jersey history and qualified by academic achievement or professional affiliation, who shall serve for terms of 3 years and until the appointment and qualification of their successors except that of the members first appointed two shall be appointed for terms of 1 year, two for terms of 2 years and two for terms of 3 years. Of the four members first appointed pursuant to this amendatory act, one shall be appointed for a term of one year, one shall be appointed for a term of two years and two shall be appointed for a term of three years. Public members of the commission shall be selected so as to provide a balanced representation of the various geographic regions of the State.
- (c) Two members of the Senate to be appointed by the President thereof, and two members of the General Assembly to be appointed by the Speaker thereof. No more than one of the Senate and Assembly members shall be members of the same political party. Anyone appointed pursuant to this subsection shall serve as a member of the commission until the expiration of his term as Senator or Assemblyman, as the case may be, during which he was appointed.

The Assembly Conservation and Natural Resources Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 1552.

This bill increases the number of citizen members on the New Jersey Historical Commission from six to 10 and requires that they be selected so as to provide a balanced representation of the various geographic regions of the State. The bill also revises the existing law to reflect changes made by an Executive Reorganization Plan that took effect on April 2, 1983.

As released, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 3563 as amended and also released by the committee.

The Senate State Government and Federal and Interstate Relations Committee reports favorably Senate, No. 1552.

This bill concerns the New Jersey Historical Commission. It increases the number of public members on the commission from six to 10 and requires that they be selected so as to provide a balanced representation of the various geographic regions of the State. The bill also revises the existing law to reflect changes made by an Executive Reorganization Plan which took effect on April 2, 1983.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1990 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
