STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED MAY 23, 1988

By Assemblymen SHUSTED and ROCCO

	AN ACT creating a permanent commission to study the general
2	corporate and business law and related statutes, prescribing
	its membership and duties and making an appropriation.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. There is created in the Legislative branch of State Government a permanent commission to be known as The New Jersey Corporate and Business Law Study Commission.
- b. The commission shall consist of three members who are admitted to practice law in New Jersey, and who are distinguished in the field of corporate and business law to be appointed as follows: one member shall be appointed by the
- Governor; one by the President of the Senate; and one by the Speaker of the General Assembly. All members shall serve for a term of three years and shall be elgible for reappointment.
 - c. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment, but for the unexpired term only.
 - d. The members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of their duties under this act
- 2. The commission shall organize as soon after the appointment of its members as is practicable, shall choose a chairman from among its members and shall appoint a secretary who need not be a member of the commission.
- a. It shall be the duty of the commission to study and
 review all aspects of the statutes, legislation and decisions of the courts in this State and other states relating to business entities,
 including business corporations and partnerships and the issuance of ownership interests or securities thereby. In addition the



STATEMENT

This bill creates, within the Legislative branch, a commission to be known as The New Jersey Corporate and Business Law Study Commission. The purpose of this commission is to study and review the laws and legislation of this State and other states dealing with business entities, including business corporations and partnerships, and the issuance of ownership interests, or securities, thereby. The commission shall also study the laws governing non-profit corporations in this and other states.

This commission will consist of three members, admitted to practice law in New Jersey, and who are distinguished in the field of corporate and business law. One member is to be appointed by the Governor, one by the President of the Senate and one by the Speaker of the General Assembly. Members may serve three year terms and are eligibile for reappointment. They will serve without compensation, although they may be reimbursed for expenses.

The commission is to submit an annual report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and Legislature and any legislative proposals it recommends for enactment.

The Assembly Judiciary Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3230.

Assembly Bill No. 3230 creates, within the Legislative branch, a commission to study and review the laws and legislation of New Jersey and other states relating to business entities. In addition, the commission shall study and review all aspects of the law governing non-profit corporations in New Jersey and other states.

This commission, to be known as the New Jersey Corporate and Business Law Study Commission shall consist of three members distinguished in the field of corporate and business law who will serve without compensation. The commission shall report annually to the Governor and Legislature.

The committee amended the bill to add a \$50,000 appropriation.

The Senate Judiciary Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 3230.

This bill creates, within the Legislative branch, a commission to study and review the laws and legislation of New Jersey and other states relating to business entities. In addition, the commission shall study and review all aspects of the law governing non-profit corporations in New Jersey and other states.

This commission, to be known as the New Jersey Corporate and Business Law Study Commission, shall consist of three members knowledgeable in the field of corporate and business law who will serve without compensation. The Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the General Assembly would each appoint one member. The commission shall report annually to the Governor and Legislature.

The bill contains an appropriation of \$50,000 for the purpose of establishing the commission.

Assembly Bill No. 3230 of 1988 creates the New Jersey Corporate and Business Law Study Commission as a permanent legislative commission. Its purpose is to study and review the law and legislation of this and other states dealing with business entities, including business corporations and partnerships, and the issuance of ownership interests or securities thereby. Non-profit corporations in this and other states will also be studied.

The commission shall have three members who are admitted to practice law in New Jersey and who are distinguished in the field of corporate and business law. These members shall serve without compensation, although they may be reimbursed for any expenses which they may incur. The commission is also authorized to employ counsel, stenographic and clerical assistants to assist it in its activities.

The Office of Legislative Services notes that the commission may require the use of one professional at an approximate annual salary of \$30,000 and one secretary at an approximate annual salary of \$15,000 to assist it in its research activities and the development of its annual report to the governor. An additional \$5,000 may be required for miscellaneous expenses, such as office space, equipment and travel, for a total first-year cost of about \$50,000.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 3230 (First Reprint)

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 15 of the Constitution, I am appending Assembly Bill No. 3230 (First Reprint) at the time of signing it my statement of the items, or parts thereof, to which I object so that each item, or part thereof, so objected to shall not take effect.

This bill would create a permanent legislative commission to be known as the "New Jersey Corporate and Business Law Study Commission" (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission"). The Commission would consist of three unsalaried members, one appointed by the Governor, one by the President of the Senate and one by the Speaker of the General Assembly. The purpose of the Commission would be to study and review all aspects of the statutes, legislation, and decisions of the courts of New Jersey and other states relating to business entities, including business corporations, nonprofit corporations, partnerships and the issuance of ownership interests and securities. The results of the Commission's findings would be compiled annually in report form and filed with the Governor and the Legislature. In addition, the Commission would submit any proposed legislation that it recommends for enactment. To assist the Commission in its task, \$50,000 would be appropriated from the General Fund.

I am aware of the generous contributions the Corporate Law Revision

Commission has made to New Jersey, in particular, the recent amendments to

Title 14A, "The New Jersey Business Corporations Act." Our State's corporate

climate depends in substantial part on the quality of its business laws.

The Commission's tireless work in updating and improving New Jersey's

corporate code thus represents an important asset that will help to ensure

the continued economic vitality of the State.

While I recognize that New Jersey needs to remain current in the ever changing business law area, and although I support the continued operation of the Commission, I cannot support the appropriation of \$50,000 to the Commission. Unfortunately, due to our present fiscal constraints, the State is unable to afford this appropriation at this time. Because I have been informed that the Commission could function in a meaningful, though more limited, fashion even without an appropriation, I have signed the bill making the Commission a permanent body into law, but have deleted the appropriation.
