1 AN ACT concerning public health priority funding and amending P.I. 1966, c.36.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 9 of P.L.1966, c.36 (C.26:2F-9) is amended to read as follows:
- Pending final passage of the applicable General Appropriations Act, the commissioner shall notify each eligible local health agency as to the priority health services and the • 11 amount of public health priority funds estimated to be payable during the next [State fiscal] calendar year to provide these services. On or before a date set by the commissioner, the health 13 officer of each local health agency, or in his absence another person designated by the official body under which the local 15 health agency operates, may submit an application for public 17 health priority funds for the following calendar year [beginning July 1]. The application shall include the budget of the agency, the plan of work and such other information as the commissioner 19 may require, to be presented in a form prescribed by the commissioner. It shall be the responsibility of the applicant to 21

The application shall be certified, under the penalties of perjury, as

The Senate Institutions, Health and Welfare Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 3082.
