BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. Section 13 of P.L. 1970, c. 40 (C.48:13A-12) is amended to read as follows:
- 13. a. Any person or my officer or agent thereof who shall knowingly violate any of the provisions of this act or aid or advise in such violation, or who, as principal, manager, director, agent, servant or employee knowingly does any act comprising a part of such violation, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than 3 years or by a fine of not more than \$50,000.00, or both; and if a corporation by a fine of not more than \$100,000.00. Each day during which the violation
- continues constitutes an additional, separate and distinct offense. 17 b. Any person who shall violate any provision of this act or any rule, regulation or administrative order [promulgated] adopted or 19 <u>issued</u> hereunder, <u>including an interdistrict waste flow order</u> issued in conjunction with the Department of Environmental Protection, or under any applicable provision of Title 48 of the 21 Revised Statutes, or who shall engage in the solid waste collection business or solid waste disposal business without having 23 been issued a certificate of public convenience and necessity, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$1,000.00 for a first 25 offense, not more than \$5,000.00 for a second offense and not more than \$10,000.00 for a third and every subsequent offense. 27 Each day during which the violation continues constitutes an additional, separate and distinct offense.
