In addition the bill clarifies the existing law with respect to smoking in all schools and universities other than the schools operated by boards of education. In those other schools and universities smoking is prohibited in classrooms, lecture halls and auditoriums and in other areas where smoking may be prohibited by municipal ordinance or State law. For the remaining areas, the regulations may totally prohibit smoking and establish areas in which smoking will be permitted.

### STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: JANUARY 23, 1989

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 3722 as amended.

As amended, Assembly Bill No. 3722 empowers the governing body of a school, college, university or professional training school, either public or private, to make and enforce regulations controlling smoking on the premises of the educational institution. The regulations may, but need not, designate certain areas within the premises as areas in which smoking is permitted.

The committee amendments remove a provision of the bill that would have prohibited smoking in any public school building. The amendments also establish that smoking regulations are matters of health and educational policy, shall not be considered conditions of employment and may be adopted without the concurrence of the bargaining unit.

The committee amendments also provide that within two years of the effective date of this act, the Commissioner of Education and the Commissioner of Health shall report to the Governor and Legislature on the actions taken by boards of education pursuant to this act and on any new scientific evidence which may be pertinent to a policy decision about smoking in schools. The report shall include the commissioners' recommendations, if any, for modifications in the law.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

**DATED: MARCH 20, 1989** 

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill with committee amendments.

This bill empowers the governing body of a school, other than a public school, and a college, university or professional training school, either public or private, to make and enforce regulations controlling smoking on the premises of the educational institution. The regulations may, but need not, designate certain areas within the premises as areas in which smoking is permitted.

This bill also requires that the board of education of each school district shall make and enforce regulations to prohibit the smoking of tobacco anywhere in its buildings except as part of a classroom instruction or a theatrical production.

The committee amended the bill to provide that the act will take effect six months after enactment in order to give boards of education sufficient time to make preparations for the smoking prohibition.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 3334 with Senate Education Committee amendments.
