INTRODUCED SEPTEMBER 14, 1987

Assemblyman LOVEYS

An Act concerning self-insurance for motor vehicles, amending and supplementing P. L. 1952, c. 173.

- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. Section 30 of P. L. 1952, c. 173 (C. 39:6-52) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 30. (a) Any person in whose name more than [twenty-five] 25
- 4 motor vehicles are registered or in whose name more than 25 motor
- 5 vehicles are leased may qualify as a self-insurer by obtaining a
- 6 certificate of self-insurance issued by the [director] Commissioner
- 7 of Insurance as provided in subsection (b) of this section.
- 3 (b) The [director] commissioner may, in his discretion, upon
- 9 the application of such a person, issue a certificate of self-insurance
- 10 when he is satisfied that such person is possessed and will continue
- 11 to be possessed of ability to pay judgments obtained against such
- 12 person.
- 13 (c) The application shall be on a form prescribed by the con-
- 14 missioner, and shall include any information which the commis-
- 15 sioner deems to be necessary to determine the applicant's eligi-
- 16 bility for self-insurance, including, but not limited to, information
- 17 on the number and types of the motor vehicles which are to to
- 18 self-insured, the proposed use of the vehicles, and financial infor-
- $oldsymbol{19}$ -mation regarding the applicant. The certificate shall be issued for
- 20 a one-year period and each holder of a certificate shall make ap-
- 21 plication for renewal.

- 22 (d) If the applicant for a certificate of self-insurance is a cor-23 poration, the commissioner may also include in the certificate of 24 self-insurance any subsidiary corporation under the control of that 25 corporation if the parent corporation guarantees that it will dis-26 charge the subsidiary corporation's liability pursuant to the provisions of this act. In the event that the ownership of the parent 27 28 or a subsidiary corporation changes, the parent or subsidiary shall 29 reapply for a certificate of self-insurance within 30 days of the ownership change. If the parent corporation does not provide a 30 31 guarantee that it will discharge the subsidiary corporation's lia-32 bility, the subsidiary shall make separate application and receive **3**3 independent qualification as a self-insurer.
- (e) The commissioner may make or cause to be made audits or examinations as he may deem necessary to determine the financial ability of the applicant or certificate holder to discharge his obligations as a self-insurer. The reasonable expenses of the audit or examination shall be fixed and determined by the commissioner, and shall be payable by the applicant or certificate holder upon presentation of a detailed account of expenses.
- 41 (f) The commissioner may require the furnishing of a surety 42 bond or evidence of excess insurance.
- (g) A filing fee of \$1,000.00 shall accompany every application for a certificate of self-insurance or a renewal thereof, except that no filing fee shall be required of any public entity which applies for a certificate of self-insurance pursuant to this section or a renewal thereof.
- [(c)] (h) Upon not less than five days' notice and a hearing pursuant to such notice, the [director] commissioner may upon reasonable grounds cancel a certificate of self-insurance. Failure to pay any judgment within [thirty] 30 days after such judgment shall have become final shall constitute a reasonable ground for the cancellation of a certificate of self-insurance.
- 2. Section 31 of P. L. 1952, c. 173 (C. 39:6-53) is amended to 2 read as follows:
- 31. No action taken by the [director] commissioner pursuant to this act, the findings, if any, of the [director] commissioner upon which such action is based, nor the security filed, as provided by this act, shall be referred to in any way, nor be any evidence of the perlicence or due care of sither way.
- 7 the negligence or due care of either party, at the trial of any civil
 8 action to recover damages.
- 3. Section 32 of P. L. 1952, c. 173 (C. 39:6-54) is amended to 2 read as follows:

- 3 32. a. This act shall not apply with respect to any motor vehicle
- 4 owned by the United States, this State or any political subdivision
- 5 of this State or any municipality therein; nor with respect to any
- 6 motor vehicle which is subject to the requirements of law requiring
- 7 insurance or other security on certain types of vehicles, other than
- 3 the requirements of P. L. 1972, c. 70 (C. 39:6A-1 et seq.) or P. L.
- 9 1972, c. 197 (C. 39:6B-1 et seq.).
- 10 b. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection a. to the contrary,
- 11 the commissioner may issue a certificate of self-insurance to any
- 12 public entity or group of public entities upon receipt of a resolu-
- 13 tion from the public entity or group of public entities that they
- 14 have established a self-insurance program or a group self-insurance
- 15 program, as the case may be.
- 4. (New section) The commissioner shall have the authority to
- 2 issue any rules and regulations or exercise any power granted to
- 3 him by Title 17 of the Revised Statutes with respect to vehicles
- 4 which are self-insured pursuant to the provisions of sections 30,
- 5 31, and 32 of P. L. 1952, c. 173 (C. 39:6A-52, 39:6A-53, and
- 6 39:6A-54).
- 5. (New section) Any certificate of self-insurance issued prior
- 2 to the effective date of this act shall remain valid for a period not
- 3 to exceed one year following the effective date, at which time it
- 4 may be renewed pursuant to the provisions of this act.
- 1 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill transfers supervision of self-insured motor vehicles from the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to the Commissioner of Insurance. The commissioner would be given the authority to require the posting of a bond or the purchase of excess insurance, as well as the authority to conduct audits or financial examinations to determine if the self-insurer continues to have the resources to pay its obligations. The bill would require a filing fee; self-insurance certificates would be renewable annually.

INSURANCE—PROPERTY AND CASUALTY Regulates motor vehicle self-insurers.
