INTRODUCED JUNE 19, 1986

By Assemblymen MORAN, DORIA, Assemblywoman Kalik, Assemblymen Collins, Hendrickson, Assemblywoman Muhler and Assemblyman Singer

AN ACT to amend and supplement the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," approved December 4, 1984 (P. L. 1984, c. 205).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 11 of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-11) is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 11. A shop licensed by the board shall employ at least one ex-  
4 perience practicing licensee to generally oversee the management  
5 of the shop. The practicing licensee shall either:

6 a. Hold a *beautician, barber or cosmetologist-hairstylist* license  
7 and have three year of experience as a beautician, barber or cos-  
8 metologist-hairstylist; or

9 b. Hold a beautician or cosmetologist-hairstylist license and  
10 have been issued a manager-operator license by the Board of Beauty  
11 Culture Control.

12 **[**Any shop licensed by the Board of Beauty Culture Control prior  
13 to the effective date of this act may also satisfy the requirements  
14 of this section by employing a practicing licensee who hold a license  
15 as a beautician and has three years of experience.

16 Any shop licensed by the Board of Barber Examiners prior to the  
17 effective date of this act may also satisfy the requirements of this  
18 section by employing a practicing licensee who holds a barber's  
19 license and has three years of experience; except that a shop which

 21 cluded from employing senior students unless the shop also employs  
 22 *at licensed schools within the State;*

 2 read as follows:

3 23. An applicant for a license to teach cosmetology and hairstyl-  
 4 ing who does not hold a license to teach beauty culture issued by  
 5 the Board of Beauty Culture Control shall submit to the board  
 6 satisfactory evidence that he:

7 a. Is of good moral character;

8 b. Is at least 18 years of age;

9 c. Does not have a communicable, contagious or infectious  
 10 disease;

11 d. Has successfully completed high school or its equivalent;

12 e. Holds a cosmetologist-hairstylist license issued by the board  
 13 or an operators' license issued by the Board of Beauty Culture  
 14 prior to the effective date of this act or a beautician's license issued  
 15 within two years of the effective date of this act;

16 f. Has successfully completed a teacher training course of 500  
 17 hours consisting of practice and theory of teaching conducted at a  
 18 licensed school of cosmetology and hairstyling *in this State or a*  
 19 *school of cosmetology and hairstyling or beauty culture licensed in*  
 20 *another state or foreign country which, in the opinion of the board,*  
 21 *offers a curriculum which is substantially similar to that offered*  
 22 *at licensed schools within this State;*

23 g. Has successfully completed a 30-hour teaching methods course  
 24 conducted by a college approved by the State Board of Higher Edu-  
 25 cation and recognized by the board *or a substantially equivalent*  
 26 *teaching methods course conducted by a college in another state*  
 27 *which is approved by the higher education authorities of that state*  
 27A *and recognized by the board;*

28 h. Has attained six months employment experience in a licensed  
 29 shop within this State which may be obtained prior to, at the same  
 30 time as, or subsequent to the period during which the applicant is  
 31 attending the 【teachers】 *teacher* training course offered by a

32 licensed school of cosmetology and hairstyling of this State *or has*  
 33 *attained six months licensed employment in another state or*  
 34 *foreign country; and*

35 i. Has successfully completed an examination conducted by the  
 36 board.

1 3. Section 35 of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-35) is amended to  
 2 read as follows:

3 35. Any practicing license issued by the Board of Cosmetology  
 4 and Hairstyling, the Board of Beauty Culture Control or the Board  
 5 of Barber Examiners may be renewable biennially if the expired  
 6 licenses are renewed within six months following expiration. Ap-  
 7 plications shall be submitted to the board and accompanied by the  
 8 fee to be determined by the board. Applications for renewal sub-  
 9 mitted more than six months after the expiration of a license shall  
 10 be accompanied by a restoration fee to be determined by the board.  
 11 *Applicants seeking restoration of a license more than five years*  
 12 *after the license has expired shall be required to make application*  
 13 *for initial licensure.* Shop and school licenses shall be renewed  
 14 within **\*[30]\*** *\*90\** days following expiration. Applicants for re-  
 15 newal of school licenses shall provide satisfactory evidence that a  
 16 bond required pursuant to section 32 of this act has been secured  
 17 and shall remain valid through the next licensing period. No shop  
 18 or school license may be restored after **\*[30]\*** *\*90\** days and an  
 19 application for initial licensure shall be submitted.

1 4. (New section) The provisions of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-1  
 2 et seq.) shall not affect the validity of any license issued by the  
 3 Board of Beauty Culture Control or the Board of Barber Examiners  
 4 prior to the effective date of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-1 et seq.),  
 5 however\*,\* a person holding a license issued by either board is  
 6 subject to the provisions of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-1 et seq.).

1 \*5. Section 21 of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-21) is amended to  
 2 read as follows:

3 21. An applicant seeking initial licensure as a barber who does  
 4 not hold a license to practice barbering issued by the Board of  
 5 Barber Examiners shall:

6 a. Demonstrate successful completion of eighth grade or its  
 7 equivalent;

8 b. Demonstrate that he held an apprentice registration certifi-  
 9 cate issued by the Board of Barber Examiners on or before the  
 10 effective date of this act and has successfully completed that  
 11 apprenticeship within two years of the effective date of this act  
 12 *or was enrolled in a public \*\*or private\*\* school vocational pro-*

13 gram in barbering on December 4, 1985, received a certificate as a  
 14 registered apprentice barber from the New Jersey Board of Cos-  
 15 metology and Hairstyling pursuant to section 6 of P. L. . . . , c. . . .  
 16 (C. . . . .) (now pending before the Legislature as this bill)  
 17 upon completion of the program and has successfully completed  
 18 an apprenticeship of 18 months duration within two years of com-  
 19 pleting the vocational program in barbering; and  
 20 c. Take and pass an examination conducted by the board as  
 21 provided by this act.

1 6. (New section) The New Jersey Board of Cosmetology and  
 2 Hairstyling shall issue a certificate as a registered apprentice  
 3 barber to any person who was enrolled in a public *\*\*or private\*\**  
 4 school vocational program in barbering on December 4, 1985 upon  
 5 the successful completion of the vocational program and payment  
 6 of a fee as required by the board. An apprentice certificate shall be  
 7 valid for 18 months from the date of issue and may be renewed  
 8 for an additional six months. An apprentice shall not independently  
 9 practice barbering, but may, as an apprentice, practice barbering  
 10 under the immediate supervision of a licensed barber.\*

1 \***[5.]**\* \*7.\* This act shall take effect immediately.

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#### REGULATED PROFESSIONS

 3 Board of Beauty Culture Control or the Board of Barber Examiners  
 4 prior to the effective date of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-1 et seq.),  
 5 however a person holding a license issued by either board is subject  
 6 to the provisions of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 45:5B-1 et seq.).

1 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

The Assembly Higher Education and Regulated Professions Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 2855.

This bill amends and supplements the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," P. L. 1984, c. 205, to provide the following:

1. That the person overseeing the general management of a licensed shop may include a beautician or barber with three years of experience. Currently, the person overseeing the general management of a shop, except for a shop licensed prior to the act's effective date, must either hold a cosmetologist-hairstylist license and have three years of experience, or hold a beautician or cosmetologist-hairstylist license and have been issued a manager-operator license by the Board of Beauty Culture Control;

2. That the teacher training course required for a license to teach cosmetology and hairstyling may be satisfied at a licensed school in another state or foreign country which in the opinion of the Board of Cosmetology and Hairstyling offers a similar curriculum;

3. That the 30 hour teaching methods course required for a license to teach cosmetology and hairstyling may be satisfied by completing a similar course in a college located in another state if the college is approved by the higher education authorities of that state;

4. That the six months employment experience necessary to obtain a license to teach cosmetology and hairstyling may be licensed employment completed in another state or foreign country;

5. That an applicant seeking reinstatement of a license more than five years after the license has expired is required to make application for initial licensure; and

6. That the provisions of the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," shall not affect the validity of any license issued prior to its effective date by the Board of Beauty Culture Control or the Board of Barber Examiners.

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**STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

This bill amends and supplements the Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," P. L. 1984, c. 205, to provide the following:

1. That the person overseeing the general management of a licensed shop may include a beautician or barber with three years of experience. Currently, the person overseeing the general management of a shop, except for a shop licensed prior to the act's effective date, must either hold a cosmetologist-hairstylist license and have three years of experience, or hold a beautician or cosmetologist-hairstylist license and have been issued a manager-operator license by the Board of Beauty Culture Control;

2. That the teacher training course required for a license to teach cosmetology and hairstyling may be satisfied at a licensed school in another state or foreign country which in the opinion of the New Jersey State Board of Cosmetology and Hairstyling offers a similar curriculum;

3. That the 30-hour teaching methods course required for a license to teach cosmetology and hairstyling may be satisfied by completing a course in a college located in another state if the course is equivalent to one given in this State and the college is approved by the higher education authorities of that state and recognized by the board;

4. That the six months' employment experience necessary to obtain a license to teach cosmetology and hairstyling may be licensed employment completed in another state or foreign country;

5. That an applicant seeking reinstatement of a license more than five years after the license has expired is required to make application for initial licensure;

6. That a shop or school license must be renewed within 90 days, instead of 30 days, following expiration or an application for initial licensure must be submitted to obtain relicensure;

7. That any person who was enrolled in a public or private school vocational program in barbering on December 4, 1985, the effective date of the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," is eligible to receive a certificate as a registered apprentice barber and may be licensed as a barber upon completing an 18-month apprenticeship and passing an examination; and

3. That the provisions of the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," shall not affect the validity of any license issued prior to its effective date by the Board of Beauty Culture Control or the Board of Barber Examiners.
