5. That an applicant seeking reinstatement of a license more than five years after the license has expired is required to make application for initial licensure;

6. That a shop or school license must be renewed within 90 days, instead of 30 days, following expiration or an application for initial licensure must be submitted to obtain relicensure; 7. That any person who was enrolled in a public or private school vocational program in barbering on December 4, 1985, the effective date of the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," is eligible to receive a certificate as a registered apprentice barber and may be licensed as a barber upon completing an 18-month apprenticeship and passing an examination; and

3. That the provisions of the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984," shall not affect the validity of any license issued prior to its effective date by the Board of Beauty Culture Control or the Board of Barber Examiners.
