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PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1986 SESSION

By Assemblyman DORIA

AN ACT to amend the "Radiologic Technologist Act," approved  
October 9, 1981 (P. L. 1981, c. 295).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 5 of P. L. 1981, c. 295 (C. 26:2D-28) is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 5. a. There is created a Radiologic Technology Board of Exam-  
4 iners which shall be an agency of the Commission on Radiation  
5 Protection in the Department of Environmental Protection and  
6 which shall report to the commission. The board shall consist of  
7 two commission members appointed annually to the membership  
8 of the board by the chairman of the commission, and **[12]** *13* ad-  
9 ditional members appointed by the Governor with the advice and  
10 consent of the Senate. Of the members appointed by the Governor,  
11 two shall be radiologists who have practiced not less than five  
12 years; one shall be a licensed physician who has actively engaged  
13 in the practice of medicine not less than five years; one shall be  
14 a licensed dentist who has actively engaged in the practice of den-  
15 tistry for not less than five years; one shall be a licensed podiatrist  
16 who has actively engaged in the practice of podiatry for not less  
17 than five years, one shall be an administrator of a general hospital  
18 with at least five years' experience; one shall be a health physicist  
19 who has practiced not less than five years; **[two]** *three* shall be  
20 practicing radiologic technologists with at least five years of ex-  
21 perience in the practice of radiologic technology and holders of

22 current certificates issued pursuant to this act; two shall be mem-  
23 bers of the general public; and one shall be a representative of  
24 the department designated by the Governor pursuant to sub-  
25 section c. of section 2 of P. L. 1971, c. 60 (C. 45:1-2.2); provided,  
26 however, that for the remainder of their prescribed terms the  
27 members **[or]** of the x-ray technicians board created by section  
28 4 of P. L. 1968, c. 291 (C. 45:25-4) shall constitute the membership  
29 of the board created by this section.

30 b. The terms of office of the members appointed by the Governor  
31 shall be three years. Vacancies shall be filled for an unexpired  
32 term only in the manner provided for the original appointment.

33 c. Members of the board shall serve without compensation but  
34 shall be reimbursed for their reasonable and necessary traveling  
35 and other expenses incurred in the performance of their official  
36 duties.

37 d. The commissioner shall designate an officer or employee of  
38 the department to act as secretary of the board who shall not be  
39 a member of the board.

40 e. The board, for the purpose of transacting its business, shall  
41 meet at least once every four months at times and places fixed by  
42 the board. At its first meeting each year it shall organize and  
43 elect from its members a chairman. Special meetings also may be  
44 held at times as the board may fix, or at the call of the chairman or  
45 the commissioner. A written and timely notice of the time, place and  
46 purpose of any special meeting shall be mailed by the secretary  
47 to all members of the board.

48 f. A majority of the members of the board shall constitute a  
49 quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
