An Act requiring * [public] * * written* notice to be given**, in certain circumstances,** to the * [governing body] * * chief executive officer* of a municipality prior to moving a State facility out of the municipality.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

2 of New Jersey:

1 1. **a.** The Division of Purchase and Property in the Depart-2 ment of the Treasury shall, prior to moving a State facility out of a 3 municipality, give *[120]* *90* days' *[public]* *written* notice 4 *by certified mail* to the *[governing body]* *chief executive 5 officer* of the municipality affected thereby. *The division, how-6 ever, shall not be required to provide this notice in an emergency 7 situation.*

**b. For the purposes of subsection a. of this section, an "emergency situation" means:

(1) A situation which threatens health or safety, or which violates
any health, building or fire code provision relating to the safe
occupancy and use of the premises;

13 (2) A situation in which the State is given less than 90 days'
14 notice to vacate the premises; or

(3) A situation in which the State is unable to reach an agreement on a lease renewal for an existing tenancy, or on alternative
appropriate space, at reasonable market value rent and terms before the 90th day preceding the date upon which the premises which

19 it occupies must be surrendered.**

2. This act shall take effect * [immediately]* * on the 90th day
 2 following the date of enactment*.

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 18 OCR.

This bill requires that, prior to moving a State facility out of a municipality, the Division of Purchase and Property shall give 90 days' written notice by certified mail to the chief executive officer of the affected municipality. The division, however, is not required to provide this notice in an emergency, which is defined to include the following situations:

(1) Those in which health or safety are threatened, or building or fire codes are violated;

(2) Those in which the State has been given less than 90 days' notice to vacate the premises; or

(3) Those in which, as of the 90th day preceding the date on which the premises of the facility must be surrendered, the State has been unable to obtain at reasonable rent either a renewal of its lease or suitable alternative space.

Committee Amendment:

The committee amended the bill to provide the definition of "emergency situation."

The Senate State Government Committee reports Senate Bill No. 18 with amendments.

As amended, this bill provides that the Division of Purchase and Property in the Department of the Treasury shall, prior to moving a State facility out of a municipality, give 90 days' written notice by certified mail to the chief executive officer of the affected municipality. The division, however, shall not be required to provide this notice in an emergency situation.

The amendments to the bill:

1. Require written notice by certified mail instead of by public notice;

2. Provide that notice be sent to the chief executive officer of the municipality rather than to the governing body;

3. Provide that there shall be 90 instead of 120 days' notice;

4. Allow for the notice requirement to be suspended in an emergency situation; and

5. Provide that the bill shall take effect 90 days after enactment.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1986 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
