The Assembly Energy and Natural Resources Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 1649.

This measure would amend the law concerning the taking of fish by net in certain ways:

First, it would eliminate the license requirement for five or fewer killi-pots of certain prescribed minimal sizes.

Second, it would eliminate the resident net fee for seines greater than 50 feet but less than 150 feet.

Third, it would remove the resident fee for the taking of killifish without a license and authorize them to be sold or used for barter.

Killifish are overabundant and do not require protection from non-commercial fishermen.

The Senate Natural Resources and Agriculture Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1649.

This bill would limit the licensing requirement for the taking of killifish. The bill also requires a license for the possession of over five killi-pots in order to retain the licensure requirement for commercial fishermen.
