Whenever [a school district desires] it is necessary to trans-4 fer [amounts] funds among line items and program categories, [or change the purpose for which funds were appropriated within $\mathbf{5}$ line items and program categories such] the board of education 6 may appoint, by resolution, at the organization meeting, a person 7 to make transfers [and changes of purpose shall not be made except 8 by a resolution of the board of education]. STATEMENT

This bill permits a school board to designate an individual to approve transfers of funds among line items or program categories contained in the school budget. Any transfers so approved shall be reported to the board and recorded in the minutes of a subsequent meeting of the board.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: FEBRUARY 26, 1987

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill as amended.

As amended, this bill would permit a board of education to designate chief school administrator to approve transfers of funds in the school district's budget among line items or program categories. These transfers would have to be reported to the board, ratified and recorded in the board minutes on no less than a monthly basis.

Under law, a board of education must prepare a line item budget detailing the amount to be spent for each item or program category. (N. J. S. A. 18A:22-8). The board has the authority to change the purpose for which funds were originally appropriated by resolution of the board. However, funds cannot be transferred from appropriations for interest and debt redemption; capital reserve funds; items classified as current expenses except to other items so classified; and, items classified as capital projects except to other capital projects. (N. J. S. A. 18A:22-8.2).

The committee amendments specify that only the chief school administrator may delegate this authority, and require that the transfers be reported on a monthly rather than on a quarterly basis.
