PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1986 SESSION

By Assemblyman CHARLES

An Act concerning public utilities and supplementing Title 48 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1. A public utility shall pay *or credit* interest at a rate pre-1 scribed by the Board of Public Utilities on any overpayment made $\mathbf{2}$ by a **residential** customer due to a billing error, unless the over-3 payment is fully refunded or credited to the customer's account 4 within *[60 days of the overpayment]* *two billing cycles after $\mathbf{5}$ 6 written notification by the customer to the utility of ** [an]** 7 **the** alleged error. For the purposes of this act, "billing error" **[shall mean]** **means** a charge to a residential customer 8 9 in excess of that approved by the board for the type of service supplied to that customer**,** or in excess of the **charge due for 10 10A the** service supplied to that customer as measured or recorded by meter or other device, except that neither the amount of an 11 estimated bill in and of itself, nor the amount due on a budget 12account installment**,** shall constitute a billing error*. The board 13 shall set and from time to time revise the interest rate in accordance 14 with appropriate prevailing marketplace interest rates. 15 2. The board shall require each public utility to annually provide .1 written notice of the provisions of this act to each of its *residen- $\mathbf{2}$ 3 tial* customers. 1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

The board shall set and from time to time revise the 6 interest rate in accordance with appropriate prevailing market-7 place interest rates.

2. The board shall require each public utility to annually provide
written notice of the provisions of this act to each of its customers.
3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill requires public utilities to pay interest on overpayments made by customers due to billing errors, unless the overpayment is refunded or credited to the customer within 60 days. The Assembly Energy and Natural Resources Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 1497 with Assembly committee amendments. This bill would require public utilities to pay customers interest, at a rate determined by the Board of Public Utilities, on overpayments attributable to billing errors, which overpayments were not refunded or credited within 60 days of the overpayment.

The committee amended the bill to: authorize the interest to be credited to the customer's bill as an alternative to a cash payment; limit such interest payments to residential customers; change the grace period from 60 days after the overpayment to two billing cycles after the customer notifies the utility that the bill is allegedly in error; and clarifies that charges on estimated bills are not in and of themselves billing errors, nor are amounts due on budget account installments.

The Senate Energy and Environment Committee favorable reports Assembly Bill No. 1497 with Senate committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 1497 would require utility companies to pay or credit interest on any overpayment made to a residential customer due to a billing error, unless the overpayment is refunded or credited to the customer within two billing cycles after the customer notifies the utility of the overpayment. The rate of interest would be set by the Board of Public Utilities, and the bill also clarifies that estimated bills, or budget payments, will not be considered overpayments. This bill also requires the BPU to require utilities to annually inform their residential customers of their right to interest on overpayments.

The committee made purely technical amendments to the bill.
