STATEMENT

This bill amends P. L. 1985, c. 287 (C. 30:9-87) to clarify that hospitals operating under the authority of chapter 9 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes by a county or municipality may enter into a contract and make arrangement with any hospital, medical school or health related facility having or using hospital services or —Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. This technical amendment fulfills the intent of the statute to enable government hospitals to avail themselves of the lower prices offered by participation in the New Jersey Hospital Association Group Purchasing Program.

The Assembly Health and Human Resources Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2608.

This bill amends P. L. 1985, c. 287 (C. 30:9-87) to clarify that county and municipal hospitals and nursing homes may contract or arrange with other hospitals or similar health care facilities for the joint purchase of materials, supplies or services "through" a private nonprofit hospital association, rather than "from" such an association as currently provided in the law.

This amendment fulfills the intent of P. L. 1985, c. 287 to allow county and municipal hospitals and long term care facilities to purchase items through the group purchasing program operated by the New Jersey Hospital Association, which has documented substantial savings to participating hospitals.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 3546 which the committee also reported on this date.

The Senate Institutions, Health and Welfare Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 2608.

This bill amends P. L. 1985, c. 287 (C. 30:9-87) concerning joint purchasing by county and municipal hospitals and long term care facilities, to clarify that these public facilities may enter into a contract and make arrangement with any other hospital or similar health care facility for the joint purchase of materials, supplies or services through, instead of from as the law currently provides, a private nonprofit hospital association.

P. L. 1985, c. 287 was enacted to permit county and municipal hospitals and long term care facilities to purchase drugs, medical supplies, food, heating oil and other items at lower prices through the New Jersey Hospital Association's Group Purchasing Program. This program has been in operation for about 15 years and has assisted the State's general hospitals which have participated in the program in achieving considerable savings in their purchasing.
