The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports this bill.

This bill provides financial incentives to encourage school districts to regionalize. The incentives are available to the first five regional districts formed after January 1, 1987.

Eligible all purpose (K-12) districts which regionalize after January 1, 1987 will receive an additional 10% in State equalization aid. Limited purpose (e.g., K-8 or 9-12) districts will receive an additional 5%. These incentives will continue for five years following regionalization. In addition, for the first two years after regionalization, these districts will receive transportation aid based on current year approved expenses. Other districts receive transportation aid based on the approved expenses for two years prior.

The bill also provides that for 10 years after regionalization eligible districts which are minimum aid districts shall receive State aid for debt service and budgeted capital outlay equal to the percentage of their current expense aid entitlement. Normally minimum aid districts are not eligible for debt service and budgeted capital outlay aid from the State.

Funds provided under this bill will be derived from an additional appropriation and not taken from the money needed to fully fund the State aid formulas.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 288 (OCR).

This bill provides financial incentives to encourage school districts to regionalize. These incentives are available to the first five eligible regions formed after January 1, 1987.

All purpose (K-12) districts which regionalize after January 1, 1987 will receive an additional 10% in State equalization aid. Limited purpose (other than K-12, e.g., K-8 or 9-12) districts will receive an additional 5%. These incentives will continue for five years following regionalization. All districts will be given transportation aid based on the amount of approved current year expenses, rather than actual expenses of the second prior year, for two years following regionalization.

In addition, minimum aid districts, which currently receive no aid for debt service and budgeted capital outlay, will receive aid equal to the percentage of their equalization aid entitlement. This aid shall be paid for 10 years following regionalization.

Any funds provided under this bill will be derived from an additional appropriation, and not taken from regular state school aid appropriations.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill will result in increased net state expenditures for equalization, transportation and debt service and capital outlay aid after some cost savings from regionalizing. The amount of increased expenditures will depend on the extent to which school districts respond to the incentives to regionalize provided in this bill. At present, it is not possible to estimate the level of that response.

The Senate Revenue, Finance and Appropriations Committee reports favorably with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 288.

This bill, as amended, provides financial incentives to encourage school districts to regionalize. These incentives are available to the first five eligible regions formed after January 1, 1987.

All purpose (K-12) districts which regionalize after January 1, 1987, will receive an additional 10% in State equalization aid. Limited purpose (other than K-12, e.g. K-8 or 9-12) districts will receive an additional 5%. These incentives will continue for five years following regionalization. All districts will be given transportation aid based on the amount of approved current year expenses, rather than actual expenses of the second prior year, for two years following regionalization.

In addition, minimum aid districts, which currently receive no aid for debt service and budgeted capital outlay, will receive aid equal to the percentage of their equalization aid entitlement. This aid shall be paid for 10 years following regionalization.

Any funds provided under this bill will be derived from an additional appropriation, and not taken from regular State school aid appropriations.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

The committee amended Senate Bill No. 288 to limit the additional school aid to the first five eligible regional school districts formed after January 1, 1987. In addition, the bill was amended to specify that any funds provided will be derived from an additional appropriation, rather than being taken from regular school aid appropriations.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill will result in increased State expenditures for school equalization, transportation and debt service and capital outlay aid. The amount of increased expenditures will depend on the extent to which school districts respond to the incentives to regionalize provided in this bill. At present, it is not possible to estimate the level of that response.

SENATE BILL NO. 288 (OCR)

To the Senate:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the Constitution, I am returning Senate Bill No. 288 (OCR) with my objections for reconsideration.

The purpose of this bill is to encourage school districts to regionalize.

The bill provides this encouragement through financial incentives which are intended to entice districts which may consider regionalization to bring such plans to fruition.

Regionalization of school districts is a public policy which I support. When individual districts come together to form a regional school district, they create a broader base of students which presents an opportunity for more comprehensive programming. However, a well planned continuum of educational programs which employs measurements and objectives consistent with an overall curriculum policy is best achieved when there is only one board and one administration. For this reason, I favor all purpose regional school districts and support the bill's policy of providing financial incentives to encourage the formation of more all purpose regional school districts.

Limited program regional school districts also serve the public interest by bringing together a broader base of students for which a breadth or educational programs may be better provided than if individual smaller districts were to provide the same services. however, limited purpose regional school districts have natural obstacles to the smooth flow of educational programs from one grade level to the next due to the fact that governance is split among several individual school districts. While they too serve policies which the public interest favors, they do not serve such policies as well as all purpose regional school districts. Accordingly, I do not support providing the same financial incentives for limited purpose regional school districts. Therefore, I recommend providing only the pupil transportation aid incentive for limited purpose regional school districts. I would maintain the three types of incentives which the bill provides for all purpose regional school districts.

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In addition, this bill contains a section which would prevent the State from providing any additional aid to newly formed regional school districts unless all other State education aid were fully funded. In view of the fiscal realities facing the State in the upcoming fiscal year, as well as those future years which we can project, it is impractical to impose this limitation. This would have the result of prohibiting the State from providing any incentive aid to newly formed regional school districts. I recommend that this section be deleted from the bill.

Therefore, I herewith return Senate Bill No. 288 (OCR) and recommend that it be amended as follows:
