1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

*[1. Commencing on July 1, 1987, State aid to libraries, in addition to the amounts authorized pursuant to N. J. S. 18A:74-3, shall
be adjusted as follows:

a. On July 1, 1987 State aid payments for library purposes to a 4 municipality or county shall be increased by an amount equal to 5 6 an average of the increases in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers in the New York and Northeastern New Jersey $\overline{7}$ and Philadelphia, Pa.-New Jersey regions from July 1, 1967 to 8 July 1, 1986 as reported by the United States Department of Labor 9 divided by 100 multiplied by the 1988 per capita State library aid 10entitlement pursuant to N. J. S. 18A:74-3 multiplied by one-fifth. 11 12b. On July 1, 1988 State aid payments for library purposes to a municipality or county shall be increased by an amount equal to 13 an average of the increases in the Consumer Price Index for all 14urban consumers in the New York and Northeastern New Jersey 1516and Philadelphia, Pa.-New Jersey regions from July 1, 1967 to July 1, 1987 as reported by the United States Department of Labor 17divided by 100 multiplied by the 1989 per capita State Library aid 18 19 entitlement pursuant to N. For those municipalities which provide tax support for both 2829a local library and a county library, the per capita aid provided 30for in subsection a. of this section shall be determined as follows: the total expenditure for library service pursuant to chapters 33 3132and 54 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes shall be used to determine the scale of per capita aid. In counties in which the free county 33 library has been reorganized pursuant to P. L. 1977, c. 300 (C. 3440:33-15 et seq.), the total payments shall be made to the munici-3536 pality. In those counties which have established county libraries pursuant to P. STATEMENT

This bill provides for an increase in State aid to local libraries to be phased in over a five year period. The additional amount in State aid represents the difference between the 1988 appropriation for local libraries and the amount that local libraries would

have received had the appropriation reflected the increase in the Consumer Price Index since 1967.

In addition, this bill provides for annual changes in State aid to local libraries to be based upon changes in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers in the New York and Northeastern New Jersey and Philadelphia, Pa. areas after the five year phase-in has been completed.

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports this bill.

This bill increases the amount of per capita aid paid by the State to support local and county libraries.

Under current law the amount of per capita aid to which each local or county library system is entitled is based upon the level of local expenditure for library services per dollar of equalized valuation. There are five aid categories, based on expenditure level. In the lowest category, where expenditures are less than 1/5 mill per dollar, State aid is \$0.25 per capita. The Assembly Appropriations Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 1777 (2nd OCR).

Senate Bill No. 1777 2nd OCR increases State aid to local and county libraries by increasing the amount of per capita aid to which such libraries are entitled.

Under current law the amount of per capita aid to which each local or county library system is entitled is based upon the level of local expenditure for library services per dollar of equalized valuation. There are five aid categories, based on the expenditure level. In the lowest category, where expenditures are less than $\frac{1}{5}$ mill per dollar, State aid is \$0.25 per capita. In the highest category, where expenditures are more than $\frac{1}{2}$ mill per dollar, State aid equals \$1.50 per capita.

This bill increases the aid amount by \$0.25 per capita in each category.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal year 1987 appropriations for local library services was \$7,735,000.00; actual payments were estimated to be approximately \$7,714,000.00. Based on 1987 data, State Library staff have estimated that changes proposed by this bill would increase aid payments by approximately \$1,842,000.00, bringing total library aid payments to \$9,556,000.00. The fiscal year 1988 appropriation for local library services is \$8,125,000.00. Current estimates on the cost of the bill based on 1988 data was not available at this time.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: NOVEMBER 17, 1986

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 1777 with Senate committee amendments.

As amended, this bill increases the amount of per capita aid paid by the State to support local and county libraries. Aid is based upon local expenditures for library services per dollar of equalized valuation. The current appropriation for local library services is \$7,735,000.00. This has remained relatively constant over the past several years. According to the State Library, the changes proposed by this bill would increase that appropriation by approximately \$1,800,000.00.

The original bill provided that State aid for local libraries would be phased in over five years to equal the difference between the 1988 appropriation for local libraries and the amount that they would have received had the appropriation reflected the increase in the Consumer Price Index since 1967. The bill also provided that this would be increased or decreased annually thereafter based upon the rise or fall of the C. P. I. The committee amendments eliminate that automatic annual adjustment in library aid, and instead increase the basic per capita formula by \$0.25.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: NOVEMBER 24, 1986

The Senate Revenue, Finance and Appropriations Committee reported this bill favorably, with amendments.

This bill, as amended, increases the amount of per capita aid paid by the State to support local and county libraries. Aid is based upon expenditures for library services per dollar of equalized valuation, currently ranging from \$0.25 per capita for the lowest expenditures per equalized valuation, to \$1.25 per capita for the highest expenditures per equalized valuation. This bill increases the aid amount by \$0.25 per capita for each category of local expenditures.

Committee Amendments:

The committee amended the bill to specify that the change first applies to fiscal year 1988 aid payments. Also, technical corrections were made in the current language of the statute to properly reflect administrative practice under the aid program.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal year 1987 appropriation for local library services is \$7,735,000.00; actual payments are estimated to be approximately \$7,714,000.00. Based on 1987 data, State Library staff have estimated that the changes proposed by this bill would increase aid payments by approximately \$1,842,000.00, bringing total library aid payments to \$9,556,000.00.
