# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED JUNE 18, 1987

By Senator FELDMAN

An Act concerning the membership of the board of trustees of the New Jersey Institute of Technology and amending N. J. S. 18A:64E-4.

- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:

- 1 1. N. J. S. 18A:6!E-4 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 18A:64E-4. There shall be a board of trustees of each of such
- 3 schools, which shall consist of the Governor and the mayor or

- 4 other chief executive officer of the municipality in which the school
- 5 is located, as  $\epsilon x$  officio members, and [eight] 10 other [persons.]
- 6 citizens of the State, not more than five or whom shall be resi-

#### STATEMENT

This bill expands the membership of the board of trustees of the New Jersey Institute of Technology (N. J. I. T.) from eight to 10 public members. It also provides that not more than five of the board members may be residents of Essex county. This revision has the support of the current board of trustees of N. J. I. T.

N. J. I. T. is now a major State institution of higher education with a national reputation as a technical institute, and the expanded board will permit the appointment of qualified individuals who cannot serve under the present law solely because they do not reside in or have business interests in the county.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports Senate Bill No. 3462 without Senate committee amendments.

This bill expands the membership of the board of trustees of the New Jersey Institute of Technology (N. J. I. T.) from eight to 10 public members. It also provides that not more than five of the board members may be residents of Essex county. This revision has the support of the current board of trustees of N. J. I. T.

Currently, the board consists of the Governor, the mayor, and eight public members appointed by the Governor. The public members must be residents of, or have business interests in, the county in which the school is located. The modern composition of the board was first established in 1952. At that time, the public members had to be residents of the city of Newark. This was expanded in 1955 to allow residents of the county or individuals with business interests in the county to serve on the board. The expansion of eligibility for board membership provided for in this bill reflects the change in the nature of the institution from the Newark College of Engineering to a major State institution of higher education.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 4379 which is on second reading in the Assembly.
