An Act concerning the residency requirement for certain borough officials and amending R. S. 40:87-15.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 1 1. R. S. 40:87-15 is amended to read as follows:

The Assembly Municipal Government Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 330 with Assembly committee amendments.

This bill permits the governing body of a borough to exempt, by ordinance, its borough clerk from the residency requirement set forth in R. S. 40:87-15, unless the clerk holds a second office for which residency is required. Under present law, borough clerks may be exempted from the residency requirement only in boroughs with a population under 2,500.

The bill was amended by the committee to allow municipalities to exempt certain enumerated officers from the residency requirement without the necessity of enacting an ordinance for each exemption.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1986 session pending technical review. As reported the bill includes the changes required by technical review.

The Senate County and Municipal Government Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 330 Aca.

Assembly Bill No. 330 Aca permits the governing body of a borough to exempt, by resolution, its borough clerk, and certain other enumerated officials, from the residency requirement set forth in R. S. 40:87–15, unless the clerk, or other official, holds a second office for which residency is required. Under present law, borough clerks may be exempted from the residency requirement only in boroughs with a population under 2,500. Certain boroughs that lack affordable housing have had difficulty filling offices with persons who can afford to live within the borough, as required by law.

A borough treasurer may be exempted from residency requirements only in a borough with a population of less than 2,500, according to the latest federal decennial census.
