An Act *[requiring that the public high school curriculum include a course of]' *concerning the" study *[in]* *of* civies and supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. *[Every local board of education shall adopt a one-year course of study in civics to be given to each student during the last four years of high school.]*

The State Department of Education shall prepare curriculum guidelines *for the teaching of civies* which **[shall]** **mau** be used by **[all]** local school boards in *[fulfilling this]*
[*partial fulfillment of the* requirement] **fulfilling the requirements** *established pursuant to N. J. S. 18A:35-1 and N. J. S. 18A:35-2*.

An Act requiring that the public high school curriculum include a course of study in civics and supplementing chapter 35 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

STATEMENT

This bill requires local boards of education to include a one-year course in civics in the public high school curriculum. Civics is a social science which deals with the functions of government and the rights and duties of citizens in a democratic society. It is the sponsor's belief that a required course in civics in high school would help make young people better informed about public issues and better able to assume responsibility as the voters and leaders of tomorrow.

EDUCATION—GENERAL

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports this bill as amended.

As amended, this bill requires that the Department of Education prepare curriculum guidelines for the teaching of civics to high school students. Local districts will use these guidelines as part of the two-year high school United States history requirement required by statute (N. J. S. 18A:35-) and N. J. S. 18A:35-2).

Current law also requires a course in "community civics, the geography, history and civics of New Jersey, and the privileges and responsibilities of citizenship . . ." in elementary school (N. J. S. 18A:35-3).

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 3141 OCR with Senate committee amendments.

As amended, this bill requires the Department of Education to prepare curriculum guidelines which could be used by local districts for the teaching of civies to high school students as part of the two year high school course in United States history.

BACKGROUND:

P. L. 1987, c. 52 (Assembly Bill No. 649 of this session) which was signed into law on February 25, 1987, requires the inclusion of New Jersey history in the two-year history sequence.

Current law also requires a course in "community civics, the geography, history and civics of New Jersey, and the privileges and responsibilities of citizenship . . ." in elementary school (N. J. S. 18A:35-3).

The committee amended the bill to make the use of the Department of Education's curriculum guidelines by local boards of education optional, thus giving local districts more flexibilty in preparing their civics education program.
