An Act increasing the compensation paid to members of the New Jersey Public Employment Relations Commission**[, granting the Commissioner of Labor the authority to review and adjust the rate of compensation in the future]** and amending P. L. 1968, c. 303.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1 1. Section 6 of P. L. 1968, c. 303 (C. 34:13A-5.2) is amended to 2 read as follows:
- 6. There is hereby established in the Division of Public Employment Relations a commission to be known as the New Jersey Public Employment Relations Commission. This commission, in addition to the powers and duties granted by this act, shall have in the public employment area the same powers and duties granted to 7 the labor mediation board in sections 7 and 10 of P. L. 1941, c. 100, and in sections 2 and 3 of P. L. 1945, c. 32. This commission shall make policy and establish rules and regulations concerning em-10 ployer-employee relations in public employment relating to dispute 11 settlement, grievance procedures and administration including enforcement of statutory provisions concerning representative 13 elections and related matters and to implement fully all the provisions of this act. The commission shall consist of seven 14 15 members to be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice 1617 and consent of the Senate. Of such members, two shall be representative of public employers, two shall be representative of public employee organizations and three shall be representative of the

Their successors shall be appointed for 23 24 terms of [3] three years each, and until their successors are ap-25 pointed and qualified, except that any person chosen to fill a vacancy shall be appointed only for the unexpired term of the member 26 27 whose office has become vacant.

The term of the member of the commission who is designated as chairman on the date of enactment of this act shall expire on the effective date of this act.

The Assembly Labor Committee reports favorably, with committee amendments, Assembly Bill No. 3266. As amended, this bill increases the compensation paid to members of the New Jersey Public Employment Relations Commission from \$100.00 to \$250.00 per six-hour day. The bill also authorizes the Commissioner of Labor to review and adjust the compensation rate of the members at five-year intervals, beginning with the first day of the sixth year following enactment.

The committee amendments specify that the commissioner's authority to review and adjust the compensation rate at five-year intervals would not begin until five years after the enactment of this bill.
