

- An Acr concerning participation in the alternate benefit program by certain employees of the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology and supplementing chapter 66 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.
- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary, 1 any former employee of the Department of Higher Education or 2 3 of the Commission on Science and Technology, created pursuant to Executive Order No. 12 of 1982, who was a participant in the 4 alternate benefit program and who has continued in uninterrupted 5 service with the New Jersey Commission on Science and Tech-6 7 nology, created pursuant to P. L. 1985, c. 102 (C. 52:9X-1 et seq.), may continue to participate in the alternate benefit program on 8 9 the same terms as if the employee was an eligible employee of the 10 Department of Higher Education.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately, and he retroactive to 2 April 8, 1985.

An Act concerning participation in the alternate benefit program by certain employees of the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology and supplementing chapter 66 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary, 1 any former employee of the Department of Higher Education or 2 of the Commission on Science and Technology, created pursuant 3 4 to Executive Order No. 12 of 1982, who was a participant in the alternate benefit program and who has continued in uninterrupted 5 service with the New Jersey Commission on Science and Tech-6 nology, created pursuant to P. L. 1985, c. 102 (C. 52:9X-1 et seq.), 7 may continue to participate in the alternate benefit program on 8 the same terms as if the employee was an eligible employee of the 9 10 Department of Higher Education.

2. This act shall take effect immediately, and be retroactive to
2 April 8, 1985.

STATEMENT

This bill permits former employees of the Department of Higher Education or the Commission on Science and Technology, created pursuant to Executive Order No. 12 of 1982, who participated in the alternate benefit program and who have continued in uninterrupted service with the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology, created pursuant to P. L. 1985, c. 102 (C. 52:9X-1 et seq.), to continue to participate in the alternate benefit program on the same terms as if they were eligible employees of the Department of Higher Education.

ASSEMBLY STATE GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE STATEMENT TO SENATE, No. 1030 STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: FEBRUARY 27, 1986

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1030.

This bill provides that any previous employee of the Department of Higher Education or of the former Commission on Science and Technology who was a participant in the alternate benefit program and who has continued in uninterrupted service with the newly created New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology may continue to participate in the alternate benefit program on the same terms as if he were an eligible employee of the Department of Higher Education.

This act shall be retroactive to April 8, 1985.

DATED: JANUARY 23, 1986

The Senate State Government Committee reports Senate Bill No. 1030 favorably.

This bill provides that any previous employee of the Department of Higher Education or of the former Commission on Science and Technology who was a participant in the alternate benefit program and who has continued in uninterrupted service with the newly created New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology may continue to participate in the alternate benefit program on the same terms as if he were an eligible employee of the Department of Higher Education.

This act shall be retroactive to April 8, 1985.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1986 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

Governor Thomas H. Kean today signed legislation to remedy pension problems for certain employees of the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology.

<u>S-1030</u>, sponsored by Senator Francis J. McManimon, D-Mercer, would allow a person who was employed with the Department of Higher Education or the original Commission on Science and Technology and who is currently employed in the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology to continue membership in the Alternate Benefit Program instead of enrolling with the Public Employees Retirement System.

This legislation protects those employees from suffering financially because of their switch in employment.

The legislation is effective immediately and applies retroactively to April 8, 1985.
