STATEMENT

This bill provides that when awarding contracts pursuant to section 7 of P. L. 1954, c. 48 (C. 52:34–12), the director may make awards to two or more bidders to furnish the same or similar materials, supplies, services or equipment under certain circumstances. This bill should expedite the delivery of goods and services to State and local agencies. The bill also would make possible more contract awards to small businesses which may be able to serve particular regions or agencies in the State but not the State as a whole.

The Assembly State Government Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1353.

- (2) Provide expeditious and cost-efficient local deliveries to using agencies; and
- (3) Enable using agencies to purchase materials compatible with those previously purchased.

The bill provides, however, that an award to more than one bidder shall not be made when a single contractor can serve the purchasing needs of using agencies.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1986 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
