

PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1986 SESSION

An Act concerning the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology in the Department of Commerce and Economic Development and amending P. L. 1985, c. 102.

The Senate Education Committee favorably reports this bill.

This bill adds the Commissioner of Education, or his designee, to the New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology. This will increase the voting membership of the commission to 16. Two other cabinet officers, the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development and the Chancellor of Higher Education, currently serve on the commission.

BACKGROUND:

The New Jersey Commission on Science and Technology was established by P. L. 1985, c. 102 as a permanent successor to the Governor's Commission on Science and Technology. The commission is responsible for the planning and development of advanced technology centers, business incubation facilities and technology extension services and has oversight responsibilities for these centers. It is also responsible for the planning, coordination and identification of high technology needs in the State, high technology research and the interrelationships between academic research and industrial needs.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1986 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.
