STATEMENT

This bill would increase the license, examination and renewal fees for licenses of convalescent and private nursing home administrators. It is the purpose of this bill to provide additional funds to cover the costs of the issuance of these licenses including the costs of administering the examination and conducting the investigations of applicants for the license.

Additionally, the bill would extend the period of time that licenses of convalescent and private nursing home administrators are valid from one to two years.

The Assembly Health and Human Resources Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1444.

The bill increases the application fee and renewal fee for convalescent home and nursing home administrators from \$25.00 to \$100.00 and raises the examination fee from \$50.00 to \$75.00. The bill also extends the licensure period from one year to two years.

This bill is intended to provide the Department of Health with the additional revenue that it needs to cover the costs of licensing and relicensing administrators of these facilities and testing applicants. Neither the licensure fee nor the examination fee has been increased in over 12 years.

The Department of Health (DOH) is required by law to license convalescent and nursing home administrators. According to figures supplied by the department for 1985, DOH is licensing and relicensing 800 administrators a year at a cost of about \$50,000.00. This figure greatly exceeds the approximately \$21,000.00 in revenues which DOH receives through the current licensing, relicensing and testing fees. This bill addresses that shortfall in revenues.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 1986-87 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate Institutions, Health and Welfare Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1444.

This bill increases the application fee and renewal fee for convalescent home and nursing home administrators from \$25.00 to \$100.00 and raises the examination fee from \$35.00 to \$75.00. The bill also extends the licensure period from one year to two years.

This bill is intended to provide the Department of Health with the additional revenue that it needs to cover the costs of licensing and relicensing administrators of these facilities and testing candidates for licensure. Neither the licensure fee nor the examination fee has been increased in over 14 years.

According to figures supplied by the department for 1985, the department is licensing and relicensing 800 administrators a year at a cost of about \$50,000.00. This cost greatly exceeds the approximately \$21,000.00 in revenues the department receives through the current licensing, relicensing and testing fees. The increase in the fees provided for in this bill should address the shortfall in revenues.
