

An Acr concerning the Passaic Valley sewerage district and supplementing chapter 14 of Title 58 of the Revised Statutes.

The Senate Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1610.

Senate Bill No. 1610 extends the boundary lines of the Passaic Valley sewerage district to encompass the entire area within the corporate limits of the city of Bayonne.

The Passaic Valley sewerage district indicates that it has sufficient capacity to accommodate the city of Bayonne and therefore supports expansion of the district's boundaries to include Bayonne. The Division of Water Resources in the Department of Environmental Protection states that the inclusion of Bayonne within the district is consistent with the proposed regional plans for the sewerage district.
