As Act concerning the part-time employment of assistant county prosecutors and amending P. L. 1970, c. 6.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 3 of P. L. 1970, c. 6 (C. 2A:158-15.1) is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 3. In any county in which the county prosecutor is required or
4 elects to devote his entire time to the duties of his office, assistant
5 prosecutors shall devote their entire time to the duties of such
6 office and shall not engage in the practice of law or other gainful
7 employment; but such assistant prosecutors may be employed with
8 compensation by any institution of higher education in this State
9 for teaching performed on an adjunct or part-time basis as part
10 of a program **[for the education of law enforcement officers]**, of
11 law enforcement education when such teaching has been deemed by
12 the county prosecutor of said county as not inconsistent with the
13 duties of the office of assistant prosecutor.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
