AN ACT concerning the abandonment of animals and amending R. S. 4:22-20.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 4:22–20 is amended to read as follows:

4:22-20. a. A person who shall abandon a maimed, sick, infirm
or disabled animal or creature to die in a public place, shall be
guilty of a [misdemeanor and punished as provided in section
4:22-17 of this Title] disorderly persons offense.

b. A person who shall abandon a [dog or cat] domesticated ani-*mal* shall be guilty of a [misdemeanor and punished as provided in

S section 4:22-17 of this Title] disorderly persons offense.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### ANIMALS—DOMESTIC

Increases the penalties for abandoning an animal to die in a public place.

The Senate Natural Resources and Agriculture Committee favorably reported Assembly Bill No. 635.

This bill would increase the fine for abandoning either a maimed, sick, infirm or disabled animal or creature to die in a public place, or a cat or dog. Currently, a person violating this statute is subject to a fine of not more than \$250.00 or imprisonment for a term not to exceed six months, or both. This bill would increase the fine to not more than \$1,000.00 and expand the scope of the prohibition to include domesticated animals.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in 1986 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.
