AN ACT concerning agricultural commodity agent licensing and
amending R. S. 4:11-21.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. R. S. 4:11-21 is amended to read as follows:

2 4:11-21. Upon the filing and approval of the application and
3 bond or securities, as the case may be, the secretary shall thereupon
4 issue to the applicant or his agent a license entitling the applicant
5 or the agent to conduct the business of receiving, buying, soliciting
6 or negotiating the sale of perishable agricultural or other agricul-
7 tural commodities on behalf of the grower, of the kind or kinds,
8 and the place named in the application, which license shall expire
9 on **[April 30]** *December 31 of the year* next following its date of
10 issuance.

1 2. This act shall take effect November 1 next following enact-
2 ment.

DATED: SEPTEMBER 29, 1986

This bill changes the expiration date for an agricultural commodities agent license from April 30 to December 31 of the year following the date of issuance.

The change in the expiration date provided by this bill corrects an oversight in the amendments made to the agricultural commodities licensure law by P. L. 1977, c. 427 (C. 4:11-28.1 et al.). Those amendments changed the dates for other procedures concerning licensure, but not the expiration date.

The Senate Natural Resources and Agriculture Committee favorably reported Senate Bill No. 641.

These amendments did not change the expiration date of the license required for agricultural commodities agents.
