This bill establishes a bill of rights for persons receiving services under the Congregate Housing Services Program, which is a State-funded program in the Division of Aging and Community Services in the Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) providing services (meal preparation, housekeeping, shopping, laundry, linens change, companionship, and personal care) to frail, elderly persons who reside in certain subsidized housing facilities.

Specifically, the bill requires DHSS to ensure that a person receiving services under the program receives those services in a manner that promotes the dignity of and shows respect for the person. In addition, the program must make information related to its services available to the manager of a subsidized housing facility that has contracted with DHSS to provide a Congregate Housing Services Program. The manager would be responsible for the distribution and dissemination of the information to its residents and would include in that information a statement that the services provided by the program are to be provided to:

- help meet the needs of a resident;
- foster the independence and individuality of a resident;
- treat a resident with respect, courtesy, consideration, and dignity; and
- assure a resident the right to make choices with respect to services and lifestyle.

The program provides meal preparation, housekeeping, shopping, laundry, linens change, companionship and personal care services to frail, elderly persons residing in certain subsidized housing facilities.
