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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 3 of P.L.1995, c.225 (C.48:4-2.1e) is amended to read as follows:
 - 3. As used in this act:

"Bus" or "buses" means and includes all autobuses, of whatever size or configuration, under the jurisdiction of the commission; all autobuses of NJ Transit and its contract carriers which are under the inspection jurisdiction of the commission; all autobuses of whatever size or configuration, that are subject to Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, operated on public highways or in public places in this State; and all autobuses operated on public highways or in public places in this State under the authority of the Interstate Commerce Commission, or its successor agency.

"Bus safety out-of-service violation" means any serious mechanical, electrical or vehicular condition that is determined to be so unsafe as to potentially cause an accident or breakdown, or would potentially contribute to loss of control of the vehicle by the driver.

"Casino" means a licensed casino or gambling house located in Atlantic City at which casino gambling is conducted pursuant to the provisions of P.L.1977, c.110 (C.5:12-1 et seq.).

"Category 1 violation" means any bus safety out-of-service violation that should have been detected during the daily pre-trip inspection or during periodic repair and maintenance procedures conducted by the driver or the operator.

"Category 2 violation" means any bus safety out-of-service violation that may have occurred after the daily pre-trip inspection and therefore might not have been detected by the operator or driver during the daily pre-trip inspection or during periodic repair and maintenance procedures.

"Operator" means the person responsible for the day to day maintenance and operation of buses.

The Assembly Regulatory Oversight and Gaming Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly, No. 2845.

This bill amends the "Bus Safety Compliance Act" to provide that inspections of buses, conducted by the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, shall not be conducted on property that is owned or controlled by a casino licensed in New Jersey, or on property, whether public or private, which is a designated parking, drop-off, or pick-up location for casino patrons.

The bill, as amended by the committee, also provides that all inspections shall be conducted at a location, designated for inspection by the commission, that shall not be on any property owned or controlled by a casino. In addition, nothing in this bill would limit or prevent the commission, or any duly authorized representative of the commission, from directing any bus located on casino property to proceed to a designated location for inspection.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amendments to the bill:

- 1) clarify that all inspections conducted by the commission are to be conducted at a location, designated for inspection by the commission, that shall not be on any property owned or controlled by a casino; and
- 2) provide that nothing in the bill shall limit or prevent the commission or any duly authorized representative of the commission from directing any bus located on casino property to proceed to a designated location for inspection.

The Senate State Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments, Assembly, No. 2845 (1R).

This bill amends the "Bus Safety Compliance Act" to provide that except in the event of an inspection undertaken in exigent circumstances, inspections of buses, conducted by the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, cannot be conducted on property that is owned or controlled by a casino licensed in New Jersey, or on property, whether public or private, that is a designated parking, dropoff, or pick-up location for casino patrons. Nothing in the bill would, however, limit the authority of the commission, or any duly authorized representative thereof, to demand and examine the bus driver's operating credentials at any such location.

Under the bill as amended, the term "exigent circumstances" means circumstances in which a commission representative determines that operation of the bus may place the public safety at risk, including but not limited to, a bus safety out-of-service violation or the inoperability of the bus.

The bill also provides that all inspections must be conducted at a location, designated for inspection by the commission, that cannot be on any property owned or controlled by a casino. In addition, nothing in the bill would limit or prevent the commission, or any duly authorized representative of the commission, from directing any bus located on casino property to proceed to a designated location for inspection. Under the bill as amended, no inspection and no check of a bus driver's operating credentials conducted pursuant to the bill could occur while passengers are either on the bus or disembarking therefrom.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

The committee amended the bill to provide that:

1) in the event of an inspection undertaken in exigent circumstances, there would be an exemption from the provision that an

inspection cannot be conducted on casino property or on property designated as a parking, drop-off or pick-up location for casino patrons;

- 2) nothing would limit the authority of the commission, or any duly authorized representative thereof, to demand and examine the bus driver's operating credentials at any location;
- 3) no inspection and no check of a bus driver's operating credentials conducted pursuant to the bill could occur while passengers are either on the bus or disembarking therefrom.

As defined in the amendment, the term "exigent circumstances" means circumstances in which a commission representative determines that operation of the bus may place the public safety at risk, including but not limited to, a bus safety out-of-service violation or the inoperability of the bus.
