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**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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1. The Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development shall give written notification to any individual receiving unemployment compensation pursuant to R.S.43:21-1 et seq., including any State or federal extension of the unemployment compensation, of the date of the final exhaustion of all unemployment compensation for the individual, not less than <sup>1</sup>[three] <u>four</u> <sup>1</sup> weeks prior to that date. The Senate Labor Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2380.

As amended by the committee, this bill requires the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development to give at least four weeks written pre-notification to any individual receiving unemployment insurance (UI) benefits, including any State or federal extension of the UI benefits, of the date of the final exhaustion of all UI benefits for the individual. The notification shall include a referral for services from the Department of Human Services and any other appropriate State agency to counsel and assist the individual to obtain any resources which may be available for the individual and dependents of the individual, including assistance regarding housing, child care, food, mental health, addiction services, and health care coverage.

The committee amendments increased the minimum prenotification requirement from three to four weeks, and added child care, food, mental health and addiction services to the list of forms of assistance made available.

As reported, this substitute bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2380(1R).
