The Assembly Homeland Security and State Preparedness Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1589.

As amended and reported by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 1589 requires all sports and entertainment facilities in the State to annually prepare and maintain a facility evacuation plan. Under the bill, a copy of the plan is to be filed each year with the municipal emergency management coordinator who serves the municipality where the sports and entertainment facility is situated. The amended bill clarifies that the facility evacuation plan is confidential and is not a public record subject to disclosure.

The bill defines "sports and entertainment facility" as any privately or publicly owned or operated facility capable of seating more than 5,000 people and is used primarily for sports contests, entertainment, or both, such as a theater, stadium, museum, arena, automobile racetrack, or other place where performances, concerts, exhibits, games or contests are held.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2010-2011 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the facility evacuation plan is not subject to public disclosure under the "Open Public Records Act."
