The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 454.

This bill raises the maximum qualifying age for exempt firemen. Under the provisions of N.J.S.40A:14-56, a fireman must be appointed before the age of 41 in order to be eligible to earn an exempt fireman certificate. This bill would amend that section of law to provide that a fireman who was appointed before the age of 46 would be eligible to earn an exempt fireman's certificate.

The bill also removes the residency and citizenship requirement. In addition, the bill amends N.J.S.40A:14-59 to eliminate the requirement that an exempt fireman's certificate must be issued within 90 days of that fireman's eligibility date. The 90-day time frame is administratively and procedurally difficult to meet and was responsible, in at least one instance, for an eligible fireman being denied an exempt certificate. The bill further amends that section to reflect the current practice of issuing exempt fireman certificates in quadruplicate form. In its current form, the section provides for the distribution of three of the copies of the certificate. Under the provisions of this bill, the fourth copy would be transmitted to the exempt fireman's department and be kept by the department as part of its permanent records.

This bill was prefiled for introduction in the 2000 legislative session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 454.

Senate Bill No. 454 raises the maximum qualifying age at which a firefighter must have been appointed in order to qualify for an exempt fireman certificate from 40 to 45 years old. The bill also removes the requirements that a firefighter must have been a municipal resident and United States citizen upon appointment as a firefighter in order to qualify for a certificate.

In addition, the bill amends N.J.S.40A:14-59 to eliminate the requirement that an exempt fireman's certificate be issued within 90 days of the firefighter's eligibility date. The 90-day time frame is administratively and procedurally difficult to meet and, in at least one instance, was responsible for an eligible firefighter being denied a certificate. The bill further amends the section to reflect the current practice of issuing exempt fireman certificates in quadruplicate form. Currently, the municipality is required to distribute three copies of the certificate within 90 days of the date of eligibility as follows: 1) one copy is filed with the clerk of the county where it was issued; 2) one copy is issued to the New Jersey State Firemen's Association; and 3) one copy is issued to the firefighter. Under the bill, a fourth copy is to be transmitted to the exempt firefighter's department to be maintained as part of the department's permanent records.

The bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 1704, also reported by the committee on this same date.

Service in more than one municipal fire department, for separate periods not concurrent, amounting in the aggregate to seven years, shall be deemed equivalent to seven years' service in a single municipal fire department and any fireman so serving shall be entitled to an exempt fireman certificate from the department and force in the municipality wherein he is serving at the time when he becomes entitled to the certificate. Governor Whitman today signed the following legislation:

S-968, sponsored by Senators Vitale (D-Middlesex) and Bennett (R-Monmouth) and Assembly Members Weinberg (D-Bergen) and Zisa (D-Bergen), creates the new third-degree offense of endangering an injured victim.

S-1383, sponsored by Senators Bucco (R-Morris) and Littell
(R-Sussex/Hunterdon/ Morris) and Assembly Members Gregg
(R-Sussex/Hunterdon/Morris) and Carroll (R-Morris), creates the Lake
Hopatcong Commission and appropriates \$3 million.

S-572, sponsored by Senators Robertson (R-Essex/Passaic) and Codey (D-Essex) and Assembly Member O'Toole (R-Essex/Union), permits simulated voting for minors at polling places.

S-454, sponsored by Senators Girgenti (D-Passaic) and Kosco (R-Bergen) and Assembly Member Wisniewski (D-Middlesex), raises the maximum age for appointment for exempt firemen to age 45. Additionally, the bill removes the residency and citizenship requirements for qaulification for an exempt fireman certificate.

A-1710, sponsored by Assembly Members Wisniewski (D-Middlesex) and Kelly (R-Bergen/Essex/Passaic) and Senators Bucco (R-Morris) and Girgenti (D-Passaic), makes a designated command structure a required element in municipal and county Emergency Operations Plans involving responses to mutual-aid fires.

A-2271, sponsored by Assembly Members Russo (R-Bergen/Passaic) and Zecker (R-Essex/Passaic) and Senator Bennett (R-Monmouth), clarifies certain duties of the municipal prosecutor with respect to zoning and building code violations.
