#### Abstract

AN ACT concerning special license plates and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

Be It Enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey: 1. The Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles shall, upon proper application therefor, issue "Promote Agriculture" license plates for any motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in the State. Under this act, any motor vehicle shall include, in addition to passenger motor vehicles, all commercial, farm use and farm vehicles issued registration or license plates pursuant to R.S.39:3-20, R.S.39:324 or R.S.39:3-25. In addition to the registration number and other markings prescribed by law, a "Promote Agriculture" license plate shall display the words "Garden State" and an emblem indicating interest in agriculture in New Jersey. The license plate shall be designed by the director, in consultation with the New Jersey Farm Bureau. Issuance of the "Promote Agriculture" license plates in accordance with this section shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.


2. An application for issuance of a "Promote Agriculture" license plate shall be accompanied by a fee of $\$ 15$, in addition to the fees otherwise required by law for the registration of the motor vehicle.
3. a. The director shall annually certify the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the division in producing and publicizing the availability of the "Promote Agriculture" license plates.
b. In the event that the average cost per license plate, as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the application fee established in section 2 of P.L. , c. (C. ) (now pending before the Legislature as this act) in two consecutive fiscal years, the director may increase the fee for a "Promote Agriculture" license plate to an amount which, as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is equal to the average cost per license plate.
4. The director shall notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain "Promote Agriculture" license plates by including a notice with all motor vehicle registration renewals, and by posting appropriate posters or signs in all division facilities and offices. The notices, posters, and signs shall be designed by the director after consultation with the New Jersey Farm Bureau.
5. This act shall take effect on the 180th day after enactment, but the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles may take such anticipatory acts in advance of that date as may be necessary for the timely implementation of this act.

## STATEMENT

This bill would establish a special "Promote Agriculture" license plate with the purpose of publicizing and focusing the public's attention on agriculture in the Garden State. The plate would bear the words "Garden State" and an emblem designed by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in consultation with the New Jersey Farm Bureau. The plates would be available to all passenger motor vehicles as well as commercial, farm use and farm vehicles.

The fee for such a plate would be $\$ 15$ in addition to the standard registration fees. These monies would be used to offset the costs associated with producing and publicizing the availability of the "Promote Agriculture" license plates and any initial computer programming fees which may be necessary to implement the "Promote Agriculture" license plates.

If, after two consecutive fiscal years, the cost of the plate is greater than the application fee, the bill authorizes DMV to increase the license plate fee to equal the certified average cost per license plate. The average cost must be certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee before it can be increased.

The food and agriculture industry is one of New Jersey's largest, ranking after pharmaceuticals and tourism in the economic benefits it brings to the State. There are approximately 9,400 farms throughout the State, with productive farmland covering nearly one million acres or about 20 percent of New Jersey's land area. Many of the State's farms are family-owned and operated. The "Promote Agriculture" license plate would help illustrate the State's support for the continued prosperity of the family farm in New Jersey.

The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 895.

As amended, this bill would establish a special "Promote Agriculture" license plate with the purpose of publicizing and focusing the public's attention on agriculture in the Garden State. The plates would be available to all passenger motor vehicles as well as commercial, farm use and farm vehicles. The plates would bear the words "Garden State" and an emblem designed by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in consultation with the New Jersey Farm Bureau. "Promote Agriculture" plates issued to commercial, farm use and farm vehicles would only display an emblem indicating an interest in agriculture.

The fee for such a plate would be $\$ 15$ in addition to the standard registration fees. These monies would be used to offset the costs associated with producing and publicizing the availability of the "Promote Agriculture" license plates and any initial computer programming fees which may be necessary to implement the "Promote Agriculture" license plates.

The New Jersey Farm Bureau, representing agricultural interests statewide, would contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the director of DMV, not to exceed $\$ 50,000$, which would be used to defray DMV's initial costs. The money contributed by the New Jersey Farm Bureau is to be collected from: 19 of New Jersey's County Boards of Agriculture, Lee Turkey Farm, the New Jersey Peach Promotion Council, the Direct Marketing Association, The New Jersey Farm Bureau and the Vegetable Growers' Association.

If, after two consecutive fiscal years, the average cost of the plate is greater than the application fee, the bill authorizes DMV to increase the license plate fee to an amount which, as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, is no greater than the average cost per license plate, or to discontinue the issuance of the plates.

The bill directs the DMV to notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain "Promote Agriculture" license plates by
including a notice with all motor vehicle registration renewals, and by posting appropriate posters or signs in all division facilities and offices.

The food and agriculture industry is one of New Jersey's largest, ranking after pharmaceuticals and tourism in the economic benefits it brings to the State. There are approximately 9,400 farms throughout the State, with productive farmland covering nearly one million acres or about 20 percent of New Jersey's land area. Many of the State's farms are family-owned and operated. The "Promote Agriculture" license plate would help illustrate the State's support for the continued prosperity of the family farm in New Jersey.

The committee amendments require the New Jersey Farm Bureau to contribute an amount, as determined by the director but not to exceed $\$ 50,000$, that is to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the DMV to produce and issue the licence plates. Receipts from the licence plate fees would first be used to reimburse the New Jersey Farm Bureau and then would be retained by the director to reimburse the division for costs incurred in producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of "Promote Agriculture" license plates.

Additionally, the amendments provide that plates issued to commercial, farm use or farm vehicles would only display an emblem indicating an interest in agriculture in New Jersey.

The committee also adopted amendments to permit the DMV to discontinue the issuance of the "Promote Agriculture" license plate if the average cost per plate is greater than the application fee in two consecutive fiscal years.

Technical review was performed on this pre-filed bill, as required under Joint Rule 18A of the Senate and General Assembly.

The bill also permits the DMV to discontinue the issuance of the "Promote Agriculture" license plate if the average cost per plate is greater than the application fee in two consecutive fiscal years.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1403.

This bill would establish a special "Promote Agriculture" license plate with the purpose of publicizing and focusing the public's attention on agriculture in the Garden State. The plates would be available to all passenger motor vehicles as well as commercial, farm use and farm vehicles. The plates would bear the words "Garden State" and an emblem designed by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) in consultation with the New Jersey Farm Bureau. "Promote Agriculture" plates issued to commercial, farm use and farm vehicles would only display an emblem indicating an interest in agriculture.

The fee for such a plate would be $\$ 20$ in addition to the standard registration fees. These monies would be used to reimburse the New Jersey Farm Bureau up to the amount contributed pursuant to section 3 of the bill and then used by the director of DMV to reimburse DMV for costs incurred in producing, issuing, renewing and publicizing the availability of the "Promote Agriculture" license plates.

The New Jersey Farm Bureau, representing agricultural interests statewide, would contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the director of DMV, not to exceed $\$ 50,000$, which would be used to defray DMV's initial costs, including computer programming fees. The money contributed by the New Jersey Farm Bureau is to be collected from: 19 of New Jersey's County Boards of Agriculture, Lee Turkey Farm, the New Jersey Peach Promotion Council, the Direct Marketing Association, The New Jersey Farm Bureau and the Vegetable Growers' Association.

If, after two consecutive fiscal years, the average cost of the plate is greater than the application fee, the bill authorizes DMV to increase the license plate fee to an amount which, as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, is no greater than the average cost per license plate, or to discontinue the issuance of the plates.

The bill directs the DMV to notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain "Promote Agriculture" license plates by including a notice with all motor vehicle registration renewals, and by
posting appropriate posters or signs in all division facilities and offices.
The bill is identical to A-895 (2R), reported by the committee on the same day.

Issuance of the "Promote Agriculture" license plates in accordance with this section shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.

## C.39:3-27.117 Additional fee.

2. An application for issuance of a "Promote Agriculture" license plate shall be accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$, in addition to the fees otherwise required by law for the registration of the motor vehicle.

## C.39:3-27.118 Contribution from New Jersey Farm Bureau.

The New Jersey Farm Bureau, representing agricultural interests Statewide, shall contribute monies in an amount to be determined by the director, not to exceed $\$ 50,000$, to be used to offset the initial costs incurred by the division for producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of "Promote Agriculture" license plates and for any initial computer programming fees that may be necessary to implement the "Promote Agriculture" license plate program. ## C.39:3-27.120 Annual certification of cost per license plate; fee increase, method.

5 a. The director shall annually certify the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the division in producing and publicizing the availability of the "Promote Agriculture" license plates.
b. In the event that the average cost per license plate, as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the application fee established in section 2 of this act in two consecutive fiscal years, the director may increase the fee for a "Promote Agriculture" license plate to an amount which, as certified by the director and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is no greater than the average cost per license plate or the director may discontinue the issuance of the "Promote Agriculture" license plate.

## C.39:3-27.121 Notification of eligible motorists.

## C.39:3-27.122 Memorandum of agreement by DMV and Farm Bureau.

7. The director and the Executive Director of the New Jersey Farm Bureau shall enter into a memorandum of agreement setting forth the procedures to be followed by the division and the executive director in carrying out the provisions of this act.
8. This act shall take effect on the 180th day after enactment, but the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles may take such anticipatory acts in advance of that date as may be necessary for the timely implementation of this act.

## Governor Whitman today signed the following legislation:

A-3038, sponsored by Assembly Members Malone (R-Burlington/Monmouth/Ocean) and Cottrell (R-Burlington/Monmouth/Ocean) and Senators Singer (R-Burlington/Monmouth/Ocean) and DiFrancesco (R-Middlesex/Morris/Somerset/Union), permits religious or charitable organizations to lease property to other tax-exempt entities without losing their property tax exemption.

A-1849, sponsored by Assembly Members Merkt (R-Morris) and Augustine (R-Middlesex/ Morris/Somerset/Union) and Senators Singer (R-Burlington/Monmouth/Ocean), Bucco (R-Morris) and Martin (R-Essex/Morris/Passaic), permits counties to increase the maximum daily compensation for members of election boards from $\$ 100$ to an amount not to exceed $\$ 150$.

S-254, sponsored by Senators Bennett (R-Monmouth) and Bucco (R-Morris) and Assembly Member Geist (R-Camden/Gloucester), amends the law concerning the reforestation of land owned or maintained by a State entity. Under current law, whenever a State entity plans to deforest an area at least one acre in size, the entity is required to adopt a plan to reforest the area. This bill reduces the size threshold to one-half acre, requiring the State to develop a reforestation plan whenever an entity plans to deforest an area one-half acre in size.

S-382, sponsored by Senator Sinagra (R-Middlesex) and Assembly Members Weingarten (REssex/Union) and Kelly (R-Bergen/Essex/Passaic) makes a supplemental appropriation of \$50,000 to the Department of Community Affairs for a grant to the National Association for Children with Autism, Inc. in Livingston.

A-2614, sponsored by Assembly Members Gregg (R-Sussex/Hunterdon/Morris) and Thompson (RMiddlesex/Monmouth), modifies the eligibility requirements for unemployment insurance and temporary disability insurance benefits.

A-895, sponsored by Assembly Members Bateman (R-Morris/Somerset) and Biondi (R-Morris/ Somerset) and Senators Singer (R-Burlington/Monmouth/Ocean) and Bark (R-Atlantic/Burlington/ Camden), establishes a special license to promote agriculture.

S-462, sponsored by Senators Singer (R-Burlington/Monmouth/Ocean) and Kosco (R-Bergen) and Assembly Members Malone (R-Burlington/Monmouth/Ocean) and Cottrell (R-Burlington/ Monmouth/Ocean), creates a drunk driver visitation program.

A-2006, sponsored by Assembly Member O'Toole (R-Essex/Union) requires a sentence imposed on inmates for assault on corrections and law enforcement employees to run consecutively to other sentences.

SCS for S-141 and S-1054, sponsored by Senators Bark (R-Atlantic/Burlington/ Camden), Singer (R-Burlington/Monmouth.Ocean), Matheussen (R-Camden/Gloucester) and Martin (R-Essex/ Morris/Passaic) and Assembly Members Bodine (R-Atlantic/Burlington/ Camden) and Chatzidakis (R-Atlantic/Burlington/Camden), increases the number of tuition-free credits that a member of the National Guard may earn in undergraduate study and extends the credits to graduate study.
